The <u>Concurrent Enrollment (CE) program</u> provides an opportunity for district high school juniors and seniors to earn both high school and college credit for college courses taken at Erie High School. Juniors or seniors may take Front Range Community College classes offered on Erie High's campus or they may take other pre-approved classes at FRCC, AIMS or CU-Boulder. Classes taken through CU are subject to higher tuition rates that are the responsibility of the student and will not fully be paid for.

St. Vrain will pay the tuition for up to two courses per semester. Students taking concurrent classes must follow strict district guidelines in order for their tuition to be paid for.

It is the student's responsibility to:

- > Fill out the <u>CE form</u> by the deadline. <u>Parent/Guardian signature is required.</u>
 - Students who do not follow the deadline dates are subject to not being approved to have the college classes paid for by St. Vrain Valley School District (SVVSD).
- > Follow all college requirements for application and registration.
- > Purchase or rent the textbooks required for the class.
- Pass the classes with a C or above. Students who receive a D, F or Withdrawal from a CE class will not be approved to take future CE courses that are paid for by the district.
- Contact the FRCC disability office if the student has a Health Plan, 504 Plan or IEP.

Please note that all FRCC courses are subject to change based on registration numbers and FRCC staffing. It is imperative for students to register for alternate electives in the event that offerings change or required paperwork is not submitted.

PS 5501 English Composition I, ENG 1021 (3 college credits) Grade 12 only - will count as .5 English credit

Prerequisite: 470 on English section of SAT or Accuplacer Sentence Skills 95+.

This course is one of the statewide Guaranteed Transfer courses.

Emphasizes the planning, writing, and revising of compositions, including the development of critical and logical thinking skills. This course includes a minimum of five compositions that stress analytical, evaluative, and persuasive/argumentative writing.

PS 5502 English Composition II, ENG 1022 (3 college credits)

Grade 12 only - will count as .5 English credit

Prerequisite: ENG 121 with a grade of "C" or better.

This course is one of the statewide Guaranteed Transfer courses.

Expands and refines the objectives of English Composition I. Emphasizes critical/logical thinking and reading, problem definition, research strategies, and writing analytical, evaluative, and/or persuasive papers that incorporate research.

PS 3820 Intro to Business, BUS 1015 (3 college credits) Fall Semester

General Elective

Foundational Course - recommended but not required for certificate

Focuses on the operation of the American Business System. Covers fundamentals of the economy, careers and opportunities, marketing, management, production, governmental regulations, tools of business and social responsibilities.

PS3851 - Business Communication, BUS 2017 (3 college credits) Spring semester

General Elective

Emphasizes effective business writing and cover letters, memoranda, reports, application letters, and resumes. This course includes the fundamentals of business communication and an introduction to international communication. 3 credits.

PS6901 American Sign Language I, ASL 1121 (5 college credits) Fall Semester

Exposes the student to American Sign Language. Readiness activities are conducted focusing on visual/receptive skills and basic communication. Utilizes the direct experience method.

PS6902 American Sign Language II, ASL 1122 (5 college credits) Spring Semester

Prerequisite: American Sign Language I (ASL 1121)

Develops a basic syntactic knowledge of American Sign Language (ASL), basic vocabulary and basic conversational skills. Incorporates vital aspects of deaf culture and community. The direct experience method is used to enhance the learning process.

PS4621 FRC MAT 1340 College Algebra (3 college credits) Spring Semester for grade 12 only; must be paired with Trigonometry MA1610

Prerequisite: C or higher in Algebra 2 or teacher recommendation

College Algebra focuses on a variety of functions and the exploration of their graphs. Topics include: equations and inequalities, operations on functions, exponential and logarithmic functions, linear and nonlinear systems, and an introduction to conic sections. This course provides essential skills for Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) pathways.

Students must complete the FRCC application and follow all required steps to seek enrollment in these courses.

*Must pass course with a C or higher to earn college credit.
