Messages to Share With Legislators:

Messages to Share with Governor Walz and Legislators

Really important to let elected officials know you are concerned about the data center explosion across the country and Minnesota's approach.

- 1) See how your [legislator voted](#) on last year's Data Center Bill.

Also, particularly for [Hermantown residents](#), Senator Hauschild (who represents Hermantown) was the chief author in the MN Senate for last year's bill to give hyperscale data centers tax exemptions into the extended future. Consider sharing your thoughts on this by contacting [Sen. Hauschild](#).

- 2) Email / call both your State Senator and your House Representative with either
 - a) **Thanking them for voting against the bill AND Sharing your concerns** about the way Minnesota is treating data centers
 - OR
 - b) **Thanking them for serving as a legislator AND Sharing concerns about the way Minnesota is treating data centers**, AND possibly, asking for a meeting

Concerns Include:

- TAX BREAKS: Giving away hundreds of millions in tax breaks to billionaire tech companies and their CEO's who are the richest people in the world.

- Insufficient regulation around water and land use
- Inappropriate (and not legal) use of non-disclosure agreements which is keeping communities in the dark about what is happening
- Energy to power data centers will increase the emissions that are driving climate change when we must be on a path of continually reducing those emissions to zero.
 - Eventually getting to carbon free energy doesn't help if they emit more until then.

Solutions We Need:

If we build data centers in Minnesota, they should be a good neighbor:

- **Data Centers Should Facilitate Our Community Clean Energy Transition**

Solutions We Need (Continued):

- **Data Centers Should Facilitate Our Community Clean Energy Transition**

→ Household upgrades can meet 100% of data center demand growth

→ Hyperscalers should pay for heat pumps, rooftop solar, and storage to get the capacity they need on the grid now, while setting us up for an affordable, reliable, and clean energy future.

- **Require Data Centers Use Already Developed Land In Need Of Repurposing**

→ Think K-Mart stores, empty parking lots, and now vacant office buildings.

This turns blight into productivity with these additional benefits:

- Heat from the data center could supply networked geothermal
- Created jobs would be in proximity to community infrastructure and surrounding businesses
- Set-backs and berms could host plants and trees that counter pollution. (See [Mini-Forest Revolution](#))

- **Require Decommissioning Bonds**

→ Developers should be required to give the community money so if the project doesn't come to fruition, or if the data center is no longer being used, the land used can go back to a workable condition.

Note: This is similar to how Alaska requires decommissioning bonds for oil wells in order to properly plug them at end of usable life.

- **Require Environmental Impact Statements**

→ Data Centers are adept at hiding information through the Alternative Urban Areawide Review (AUAR) process. Communities deserve better. State law must require each hyperscale data center to undergo an Environmental Impact Statement – a document that gives regulators and the community an opportunity to understand the specific environmental impacts the data center would have.

- **Require Each Hyperscale Data Center to Get its Own Water Permit**

→ Hiding a data center's water use in the municipality permit means the public won't know how much water the center is using, and it will be shielded from needing to use less in times of drought.

“I’ve never seen or heard of anything like this from any federal court,” Sen. Chuck Grassley (R-Iowa) said in a Senate floor speech Monday.

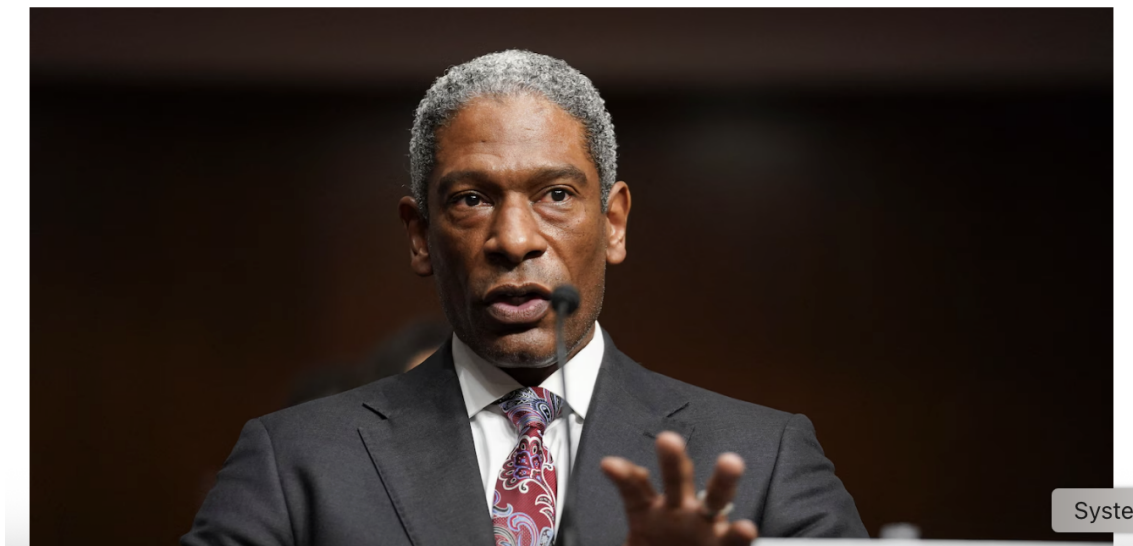

Contamination increases when the

- People don't test their wells as much as they should. Most people do not test at the frequencies they should. And most wells have present contaminations.

Policy Recommendations slide

Wondering if this statement is true:

In an air-cooled system, you still need water, but that water is used to cool the air, so that water can't be reclaimed — because it evaporates.
