Glossary of Terms Found in the MAP Report

The Fall MAP Growth Reports represent the test data in a line graph. The blue line is the **Student's RIT. RIT** stands for **R**asch un**IT** scale. The RIT score is given after each test. It is an estimation of the student's instructional level and also measures student progress or growth in reading, language usage, or math.

- The orange line is the **District Grade Level Mean RIT. It** is the average score for students in each grade level at WES.
- The yellow line is the **Norm Grade Level Mean RIT.** It is the average score for students in the same grade across the country who tested in the same content area.
- The **Student RIT Projection** represents NWEA's best **estimate** of the average or typical performance for students in the same grade, in the same subject, and with the same starting RIT score.

Term/Year: Identifies the season in which a test was taken. For instance, FA21 means the Fall 2021 administration.

RIT Score Std Error: The numbers on either side of the percentile rank define the percentile range (the RIT score +/- standard error). If retested soon, this student's percentile rank would likely be within this range most of the time.

RIT Growth: An estimation of a student's instructional level and also measures student progress or growth in school.

Growth Projection: A student receives a growth projection after their first test administration. The projection provides an estimate of what might be considered a reasonable growth expectation for that particular child. The growth projection is based on the student's grade, starting RIT score, and the subject tested.

Percentile Range: Indicates how well a student performed in comparison to the students in their specific grade and subject. (72% range=the student scored better than 72% of their peers in the norm group).

Goals Performance: The sub-scores of the overall Math, Reading, and Language Usage tests. These sub-scores are now referred to as Instructional Area scores. Taken together, they give us the overall RIT score. Individually, they describe student performance in specific sub-categories.

Lexile Range: A correlation between the NWEA Reading RIT score and the Metamatrics Lexile scale that helps identify appropriate level-appropriate reading material for an individual student.
