### **Partner and Community Spotlight**

**Partner Spotlight: Jessica Houari ( Hospitality Hub)** Working to end homelessness in Memphis by connecting individuals with the resources they need to achieve stable housing and better health outcomes. Services offered daily include the Daycenter, Work Local Employment Program, Hub Hall and Hub Hotel. These services and programs are open to those seeking help and agencies needing assistance for their clients.

### **Partner Update: Toni Williams (CCWTN)**

Provides help to those in need and brings them hope by supporting them on the path from poverty to self-sufficiency. Serves people regardless of religious beliefs, socio-economic status or ethnic background. Our homeless programs are as follows:Homeless Services Program, Outreach, Genesis Homeless Services, St. Sebastian Veteran Services, Youth Services, Emergency Services, Community Support Services, Housing Services, Job Placement.

### **New Business and Consortium Updates**

During the February meeting the Planning Committee discussed developing a new plan for 2023. The Memphis Public Library and Linc-211 services have expanded to include licensed social workers to serve the community better. There are two full-time social workers and outreach specialists will be based at five Memphis Public Library Branches around the city. Social Workers and outreach specialists will be at Benjamin L. Hooks Central Library, Whitehaven, East Shelby, Hollywood, and Raleigh from 10 AM to 6 PM Monday through Friday. The service

is free to anyone who needs assistance. The group expressed a need for more resources for senior citizens.

Darkness II light Homeless Shelter, Neighborhood Christian Center, Trinity Outreach, Habitat for Humanity, Aging in place, Aging Commission, MIFA: Meals on Wheels, Through the Aging Commission and Ombudsman services, Mifa Senior Services, Memphis Health Center: provides medical services for those experiencing homelessness

**Youth Action board:** Completed recruitment cycle, hired a staff member for the host program, and youth housing navigation program is working well.

**Health Care Committee:** Working to streamline coordination of care within health care services and referral agencies that work with those experiencing homelessness
