GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. All awards will be made on the recommendation of the Haliburton Highlands Scholarship Fund Executive.
2. Candidates for awards must be full-time residents within the limits of the Haliburton County School Area, and shall have been full-time students of the Haliburton Highlands Secondary School for the year in which the award is given.
3. The Candidate must have received the necessary entrance requirements and must be proceeding to further education at a post-secondary institution, or in a specialized area of study, or be in attendance at the Haliburton Highlands Secondary School. Apprenticeship is considered to be further education.
4. The Candidate must not be repeating the subject in the grade for which the award is given.
5. An Award is awarded to the student with the highest mark in the subject in the year concerned.
6. A Bursary is awarded to the student meeting special requirements and judged to be most deserving by the Scholarship Fund Executive. Consideration will be given by the Executive to such factors as financial need, award, general behaviour, and involvement in school activities by the Candidate.
7. In the case of a student who has chosen to defer attending post-secondary school and who wins an award which is conditional on the winner pursuing post-secondary education, the scholarship or bursary shall be awarded to the student but the award money will be held in trust for the student in the Scholarship Fund for a period of one year. If after one year the money held in trust cannot be given to the student because he or she is not pursuing post-secondary education, or if the money is not claimed by the award winning student within one year from the date it was awarded, then the money shall be forfeited and will be used by the Scholarship Committee as it deems fit. A one-year extension of the deferral will be allowed if the student applies by June 30th in the year following the first deferral year. The student must still be planning to attend postsecondary school. No further extensions will be allowed.
8. If, in the opinion of the Executive, in any year there is no suitable Candidate for an award, the Executive may withhold the award for that year.
9. In the event that two or more Candidates tie for an award, the Executive may divide the award evenly, or may make the award on the basis of need.
10. Money that is not claimed by the award-winning student by December 31 of the year in which it was awarded will be forfeited and the money used by the Scholarship Committee as it deems fit for redistribution towards student awards in the future.
11. Awards designated in the Directory as established are administered by the Haliburton Highlands Scholarship Endowment Fund. The values of these awards may vary because of fluctuating interest rates.

HISTORY OF THE H.H.S.S. SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Haliburton Highlands Secondary School Scholarship Fund presents over 200 awards to the undergraduates and graduates of H.H.S.S. every year.

Eighty-five of those awards come from the Haliburton Highlands Scholarship Endowment Fund. Many people and organizations have donated money over the years and the interest generated from these funds provides the money for these awards. The Endowment Fund continues to attract donations, often to provide an award in memory of a loved one.

The remaining awards are donated annually by businesses, service clubs and individuals throughout Haliburton County and beyond.

Almost 70 years ago, Harold Herlihey, a well-known and respected businessman in Wilberforce, donated money. This money was to be invested to provide an award in honour of his father. This award was to be presented to the graduating student with the highest overall average. The F. D. Herlihey Memorial Scholarship was the first award in our HHSS Scholarship program.

A few years later, Mr. Herlihey created another award in memory of his mother, the Mrs. Jean Herlihey Memorial Bursary.

Mr. Herlihey's brother, M. Robertson (Bob) Herlihey, was a teacher, and later a Vice-Principal of H.H.S.S. He assumed the responsibility for looking after the two investments which his brother had donated, and decided that it would be a good idea to have more. He talked to everyone and anyone who might be willing to donate money to establish an award. In many cases, individuals and organizations agreed to make annual awards. Some of the awards, which were established in the 1960s, were donated by the Rotary Clubs of Minden and Haliburton, and by the Royal Canadian Legion, Branch 129. Since the 1960's these organizations have added several more awards and bursaries.

In 1971 there were eight awards produced by investments and twenty to thirty awards from annual donations. Throughout the seventies the program continued to grow as Bob Herlihey encouraged the citizens of Haliburton County to support our high school students.

Bob retired from teaching in 1976, but he continued to serve as Chair of the Scholarship Fund for another nine years, and yet more awards were added to the catalog. The program we have today is Bob Herlihey's legacy to H.H.S.S.

The Scholarship Committee is very grateful for the overwhelming support we receive from Haliburton County and beyond. The H.H.S.S. Red Hawks are fortunate to receive this amazing financial assistance.

BURSARY PROGRAM OVERVIEW

General Description

Each year, over \$20,000 is distributed to students through the HHSS Bursary Program. The purpose of the Bursary Program is to provide financial assistance for graduates as they pursue their interests beyond high school. A bursary is a monetary grant presented to a deserving graduate. Funds have been made available through donations from a number of generous community members and organizations. Any student graduating from Haliburton Highlands Secondary School may receive funds through the Bursary Program.

All graduates are encouraged to apply for bursaries. A selection committee will review all applications and make appropriate selections based on a number of criteria including financial need, contributions to the school and community, outstanding character, and future area of study. Other specific (appointed) bursaries are also available.

Eligibility

To be eligible to receive a bursary, candidates must:

- be enrolled at Haliburton Highlands Secondary School
- be in their graduating year
- successfully meet graduation requirements
- complete and submit an on-line application form on or before the deadline

Application Process

Complete and submit the on-line application form (link provided below). Follow the instructions listed on the application. You must be logged on to your TLDSB Google Drive account in order to complete the form. Application forms must be submitted in order to be saved. You can return to edit your submitted form at any time before the final deadline of May 31.

Important Dates

March 1st – application form is open to students

May 31st – Final Deadline for Bursary Applications
Applications received after the deadline will not be accepted.
