It was the fear of failure as she had experienced too often in the past that led to a feeling of, "what does it matter, it isn't going to work out anyway."

She was pretty timid as she came into the class again yesterday, but also smiling as she sat in the front row. She wants to transform her life. Thank you, Aaron, for doing your job so well.
