Section 1 - Purpose

For the purpose of protecting American workers from conflicting their religious beliefs with government work; we propose Government workers would not be required to sign their name on legal documents that disagree with their 1st Amendment rights, specifically religion and belief. States, like Kentucky, have already stated our Freedoms come first and we cannot be forced to break our beliefs for ones we disagree with.
