A. Introduction

All text is written aligned left and right with a paragraph at the beginning of the paragraph (1 cm). Type the introductory text here in Times New Roman 12 pt font, 1.15 spacing, the beginning of the paragraph indented 1 cm, and in one column. Technical terms must be defined. Symbols, abbreviations, and acronyms should be defined the first time they are used.

The introduction contains (1) the importance of the topic of the article being researched; (2) Describe the analysis gap/research gap (3) quote previous research related to the topic of the article being researched in the form of a description regarding what people already know; (4) describe the shortcomings of previous research; (5) describe the novelty of the research conducted; (6) describe the research objectives.

B. Method

All text is written aligned left and right with a paragraph at the beginning of the paragraph (1 cm). Type the text here in Times New Roman 12pt font, 1.15 spacing, and the beginning of the paragraph indented 1 cm in one column. The method contains (1)

the research method used; (2) data collection techniques, including what data is collected, how to collect it, who are the subjects and objects of research; (3) data analysis and interpretation techniques (Creswell, 2018). Mathematical equations are written in editable text (equation) form and not as images.

C. Results and Discussion

The research data is described first, followed by a discussion. The results and discussion subtitles are written separately.

Results

All text is written aligned left and right with a paragraph at the beginning of the paragraph (1 cm). Type the resulting text here in Times New Roman 12pt font with 1.15 spacing and in one column. The results section contains research findings obtained from adequate research data. Research results and findings must be answers or research hypotheses that have been previously stated in the introduction section, where an explanation must follow all data/results (Goyal, 2022) .

If you include tables, figures, or other illustrations, write according to the example below (Bissett-Johnson, 2021) . All tables and figures must be cited numerically in the article text. Note the resolution requirement for images of at least 300 dpi.

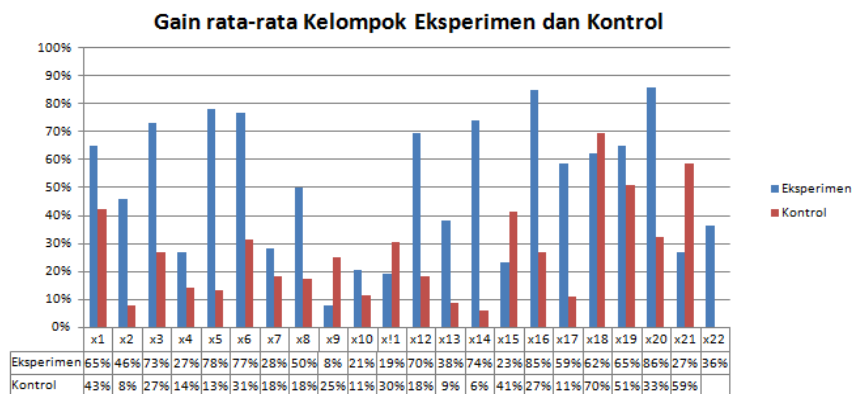


Figure 1. Gain Score for Experimental and Control Groups

D. Conclusion

Type the text here in Times New Roman 12pt font, 1.15 spacing, and one column. The conclusion contains four things: (1) restate the research objectives; (2) description of research findings supported by sufficient research data; (3) inform the limitations of the research; (4) Recommendations for future research.

References

The bibliography listed only contains sources referred to or included in the article. We recommend preparing a bibliography with bibliography software like Mendeley, EndNote, Reference Manager, or Zotero to avoid typing errors and duplicate references.

There are at least 25 reference sources, with 80% coming from primary reference sources, such as scientific articles from research published in scientific journals and proceedings, research reports, dissertations, theses, and research books. Maximum secondary reference sources are 20%, such as scientific articles, Systematic Literature Reviews (SLR), and books. The technique for writing a bibliography is using the APA (American Psychological Association) Style citation system and 6th edition. Writing the Reference List in Times New Roman 12pt font, one spaced and 6pt spacing (After Text) ^{between} references, arranged in alphabetical order according to the Author as in the following example:

General Provisions

Articles include research results, initial study results, or original ideas of the author that have never been published before and are not the result of literature studies.

Page Setup

Articles are typed on A4 paper, with the right, left, top, and bottom margins, 3 cm, with Times New Roman 12pt font, and for Arabic writing, with the traditional Arabic 16pt font. The maximum number of pages is 12 - 15 pages (first page - References).

Sub-chapters

Each Sub-Chapter (Introduction, Methods, Research Results, Conclusions) is typed in the order A, B, C, D, written in bold, Capital Each Word, Times New Roman 12pt font.

Language

Articles can be consistently typed in English.

References/Citations

Requests/citations using the Innote reference technique limited to (last name, year) such as (Pujiastuti, 2016) with APA style (American Psychological Association 6th Edition), and including the page number of the quotation are also allowed, for example, (Kartikasari, 2018) or (Kartikasari, 2018: 32). Must use reference management software such as MENDELEY or ZOTERO. All references must be taken from primary sources (national and international reputable scientific journals indexed by SCOPUS, Web of Science, and SINTA) published in the last ten years, at least 80% of the references used (minimum 25).

Plagiarism Checking

Articles submitted will be checked for plagiarism (a maximum of 20%) using Plagiarism Software and then adjusted to the OJS management mechanism.
