Leslie Hutchins when family members cast Leslie Hutchins ashes on the sea at Lyttelton they felt they were sending him home. The highly decorated naval officer died in Christchurch in 2004, he was 86. He had real passion for the sea. The North Atlantic was his home. He saw God on the sea his son said. English born he learned to sail as a youngster and joined the volunteer Nanal Reserve. When world war 2 broke out Hutchins helped evacuate British soldier from Dunkirk then sailed on convoy escort duties in the North Atlantic. Commissioned as an officer in the North Atlantic. Commissioned as an officer in the Royal Navy he served on motor launches landing secret agents and raiding parties in France. His courage on one mission in

which he took over the vessel when the captain was severely wounded by enemy aircraft attack. He was recognized with the award of the Distinguished service cross. He was Mentioned in Dispatchers for his actions as skipper of a minesweeper escort at the D Day invasion.

His son often asked his father about the war but could remember him talking about it only once and then saying little.
