




Yo, Ally! Just when I thought I had managed to win my way here, BAM; a final endurance challenge gets handed my way. Ho boy. Let's do this.

• Why do you believe that Hayley was the right choice to take to f2 and not Olive? What was better about Olive's game, and why do you think you would have lost to him?

The choice was going to be difficult no matter what, but I at least feel I have a fighting chance against Hayley. Despite our similar games, I felt the things I brought to the duo was able to outweigh what she brought in order to get us both here

(personality wise I admit she is more Alpha, but I think in terms of game sense I feel as if I am), and I always felt like I was better positioned to survive than she was, until the last round of the game. Olive was confident that he could win if he made it, and I kind of agree. I had to burn a lot more bridges than he had to (which I think totalled zero), the "worst" thing that was said about him by players as they exited was that he was playing a floater's game (which frankly isn't even that bad, because I can respect a floater's game) which is nothing compared to heat I got, and ultimately, as I had said, he would be able to take all the credit for me axing Hayley at the end. I could argue to the moon and back that I felt I needed to axe her to win, but he just needed to say "I got him to evict her, I made him throw away his chance to win" and it would be done. Plus, having one of the more vocal players advocating for his win could help, especially if she felt the need to write her speech to all of ya'll as to why he should, which happens in these games as you know. Hayley was the right choice over Olive, and Olive knows this too; it just so happened my F2 was the opponent I would have better odds against, and it's no coincidence he had one with her, too.

♦ Do you believe that you coasted throughout the game, or do you believe that you earned your spot in this F2? Why?

I do believe I earned my spot here. There are certainly parts of the game which could have been viewed as coasting, probably during my trip out east/during my finals, but I was putting in as much work as I could, even still, by keeping in touch with the players I knew I needed to keep in touch with. Coasting would be not winning challenges by throwing them thinking I was safe; fuck, I even went ahead and won one that probably hurt my game more than helped considering members of the alliance could have done the dirty work for me. Coasting would have meant me not kissing ass with every HOH, making sure I tried my hardest to make sure I knew where their head was at, and made sure I got what I wanted heard; the two times I feel I didn't get to, my alliance mates did it on my behalf, because I worked hard to get them to trust and yes, like me, and try to keep me safe. Coasting would be not having worked my butt in making sure I had multiple alliances and contingency plans ready to fuckin' roll in the event the main alliance I helped create ever lost power. I made sure to latch on to every power player I could see, made sure that any player I wasn't aligned with was out before the crucial jury phase started when the opportunity presented itself, did my best to try and make every player I was aligned with viewed me as a possible option for them to keep me and damn it, I don't think I did all of this perfectly, but I did it better than anyone else.

♦ Why do you think that you went unnominated for the duration of this game? What do you credit this to?

Connections. At the time they won HOH, I was only ever not aligned with the HOH twice; Collokey week two, and deandean on his hell week, which may not even count, but fuck it, let's count it for the sake of argument. I was under the belief that Collokey was wary of me those first few rounds, because of what you had told me about the Sandbox alliance, but I still made sure to try to talk to him, setting aside my personal reservations. In conjunction with alliance mates going up to bat to him to keep me safe (because I was never brought to his HOH room, damn it Collokey) I think me being open and friendly and available at the drop of a hat to him helped. I mean, Collokey and I would have a Final Two by the time the game was over, so we had certainly gotten somewhere. Also, I wasn't aligned with deandean when he left, which was why it was easy to vote him out over OLAC (who I was aligned with), so when he came back that was... cute, but still, the EXCLUSIVE FOUR who got to go viewed me as someone they didn't want to see go up. Every other time, I either won HOH, or someone who had my back won. I made sure players felt like I was always with them, so that when they did win HOH, I wasn't there simply to push my own agenda (which I was) but it was just another day of us working together. By the end, things got tight of course, so I either won the appropriate challenges, or spoke with the HOH at the time to make sure that others went up, which had pretty much become Hayley. I think I made people *not* want to nominate me, and that's a huge fucking deal in a game where the only way you face danger is getting nominated.

Admittedly, I don't think I brought much of an entertainment level as a character, as I saw the finish line draw closer and closer, my gamebot level exponentially grew. I think in alliance chats or in calls I was entertaining, but *it didn't make the edit!!! SMH!!!* In terms of entertainment being flashy moves, maybe just barely with a comp win or not using a veto or something. Thankfully, I promised impressiveness first; and I don't think it's fair to say what I accomplished wasn't impressive. Ally, I'm going to use your own words that you use

just a few paragraphs before you called my game not impressive:

Congratulations on making it to f2 completely unnominated. That's **incredibly impressive** and something that even the most amazing ORG players often don't achieve, so ultimate kudos to you for that.

Look, it's not that exciting, but I did something that none of you did, no one in EMBB did (edit: oh nm), and a big point of this game is getting to the end to plead your case; fourteen of you failed, and the other was nominated at some point *four times*. You say in your question that "[I] did nothing that [you] didn't expect or predict from [me]" but again:

If you predicted me to be dropped and flopped, I'm again proving you wrong. Not only that, but I was never dropped by an alliance; in fact, when the time was up, I always dropped first, or didn't give them a chance to drop with a challenge win; there are many this applies to, even outside of Mishpocheh, including N1ed, Seplo, Collokey, and even you. Your words: I played a fucking impressive game, and not the one you expected or predicted of me. It wasn't as bold and forward and transparent as my opponents, and it wasn't flashy and hoot-inducing, but you say it yourself: Ultimate. Kudos.

♦ You said in your speech that you wanted to highlight the differences in your and Hayley's games, but almost everything you said was "Hayley and I" or "Hayley told me" or "Hayley wanted". What moves did you make that were solely yours and were not influenced or impacted by what Hayley or your other allies wanted?

It's a bit of a trap, you know? As I said, I had an active alliance with everyone come the jury, so any action I could have done would have been what at least *one* of my allies would have wanted. Which is pretty damn great, in a way, because someone would always be happy with me, but that's not what you want from your question. I branched out early, and hard. I had four different alliances going in the first 24hrs, and made sure that I was going end up in the majority of each one, and that's what I think is the major difference of our games; she had to rely on Mishpocheh. Mishpocheh had to rely on Mishpocheh, except for me. I had established strong relationships with 'the enemy' so that if Mishpocheh sank, I had dry ground. I had a options, and worked hard to make sure I had those options ready to go. When Seplo/Hayley/I had an alliance, I made sure that Seplo and her would always take me over each other with our own respective alliances. When we saved N1ed over

OLAC, N1ed was telling me that Hayley and I were his go to, but that he was with *me* 100%. I made sure that the people who benefitted me most stayed, and any backups that other members of Mishpocheh made/were making were snuffed in favour of mine. I had the backups, and I kept my relationships with others strong. Hayley burned bridges and limited her options that got her to the end. I think, if Hayley wasn't casted, I'd have done just fine. I think, if I wasn't casted, Hayley wouldn't have.

♦ I messaged you about chicken nuggets and you did not reply. Why should I vote for you? (Love you. ♥)

Honestly, I was jealous. SALTY. I wanted those chicken nuggets; you know it, I know it, the hosts knew it. I blamed you for stealing my showmance from me, even though I saw they were happier to be with you. I had everyone in this damn game on my side and under my control, and you took them, I didn't want to freak out on you, ok?

♦ Sum up your game in 50 words or less.

Pragmatic, dominant, diplomatic; I think undervalued? Also, in the almighty words of Daft Punk who I listened to non-stop during the final endurance challenge: Work it harder, make it better, do it faster, makes us stronger, more than ever, hour after hour; work is never over.

♦ What do you believe was strongest, your social game, your strategic game, or your physical game? How much did each of these aspects contribute to you sitting in F2?

I think my physical game is likely my strongest, which is probably going to BORE the shit outta you, but besides like, the Deal/No Deal challenge or the Winterbells challenge, I think I did damn well in nearly every challenge, and won every challenge I needed to. I do think that I did get fortunate by the amount of logic/creative challenges that got handed out, but I held my own with the others. Despite thinking my 'physical' game was the strongest, I think I rocked the fuck outta the other two as well. All three of the aspects played a huge part to get me here; strategically I think I have the edge on Tigress, despite having worked together all game I knew the importance on having many options outside of the main alliance, and socially; I mean, I never made enemies like she did (besides perhaps Nikki as she was leaving), and **never** got nominated.

Socially, people wanted me safe because of what I could offer them strategically, and when that was ever at risk, I flexed my muscles to get the clutch wins.

♦ Tell me, specifically, what you did that was better than your opponent's game. I know you're BFFs, but don't hold back! Compare your games side by side and tell me why yours was better.

THE QUESTION OF THE YEAR. I feel like I've had to answer this a few times, so here is the tl;dr version.

My game was better than Hayley's because I had more routes to the end than she did. I don't claim everyone at the jury phase viewed me as someone who they considered taking far into the game; but I think a damn lot of ya did. I feel after her blow up with Collokey, all of her ways to the end were from people from Mishpocheh, while I made sure I didn't just rely on it. It was successful, but one lost HOH could have easily jeopardized it. Any outside from Mishpocheh alliances that we made together, I felt the third person would always take me over her, thus cutting her route off.

Secondly, I was **never nominated**. I was never in any risk or danger at any point. I either won the HOH, or was presented in a way that made people not want to nominate me, perhaps the most basic and elementary but important part of the game.

Finally, I never stopped playing. Yes, I got busy with life, but I made sure to always make sure that the people who wanted to trust me, trusted me. I never threw away opportunities to repair relationships, and I played hard from start to now, while Hayley admits she didn't have desire to win, and admittedly sat back after Collokey left.

♦ What do you think was your lowest point in the game and how did you overcome it?

Honestly, this will sound dumb, but the lowest point in the game is *now*. I didn't have a low point, or a moment of vulnerability, because I was never personally in any danger. Now that I'm here I'm getting some kinda anxious. Nerves are shot the likes I never felt in the game, and it is humbling. I'm shook I may not win, but I'm trying to overcome it with reminding myself that I'm proud of the game I played regardless of the outcome, and bringing it back to those ridiculous yet thrilling days of debate club/mock jury to get this jury to be as impressed as I am. Smiling. I'm *trying*, fam.

♦ Is there any specific thing that you regret?

Not making time to talk to Nikki before she left about why we did what we did. I reap what I sow. I don't regret the move, but regret not making time to treat her decently. Playing this game during finals because stress+stress = a decidedly unstylish Style.

♦ What do you think your biggest/best move was in the game?

I don't think you're going to count the 'winning shit' or 'not getting nommed' things here; I think you're looking for a specific move, so here it is; my best move was voting to evict you over Gage during the third eviction vote. Listen, I knew you were staying; it was very evident that my final two with Gage was dead because there was no way to get the votes for him, and it was time to let him go. Association with him would prove deadly because he had suddenly turned into persona non grata, and I knew his execution was nigh; but The Gay Agenda was optimistic. To save face with those kids, I promised to vote with them, giving a bit of hope. Now, Mishpocheh I think expected me to vote out Gage, and I told them I did, but when the votes came up, Gays could see I voted with them. Now, in the event it was ever questioned on me, I had this huge elaborate scheme ready to go where I throw ashes under the bus and now she has her own agenda and no one is working with her and no one knows where her head was at, because she was one of the few players left I wasn't aligned with and wanted those three out ASAP. Thankfully, she was voted out without me having to lie; I don't know if everyone outside of The Gay Agenda knew I was that vote (did you?) but by voting with them, I think I gained a lot of trust with those kids. Although still wary of the relationship with Sammy/OLAC, I think me voting with them garnered me a lot of trust with OLAC, who would tell me some stuff going on in Sandbox Alliance chat and who I went to form a strong relationship with. However, the trust with N1ed and I grew tenfold. I think he saw that, with the votes adding up correctly, I was voting with him, and he could trust me even moreso after campaigning hard for him the first round. I get him to tell me about the F5HOH he has possession of (why I was not duped by his 'oh i didn't have it afterall lolz' speech, that and Trip coming clean) and he kept me in the loop for every vote he made and every score he had and every plan he wanted. I had my own little lackey who was always on my side, and it was someone I didn't start the game knowing. It's a real shame he basically stopped caring then got banished from the jury. >_>

Plus, hey it's a move that was all me; Hayley's biggest move required Trip and I to go along with her (mind you I was more than happy to, because it helped to further isolate Collokey for myself by crippling the Nikki/Collo/Olive alliance) but I didn't even tell Hayley about my vote until after Gage was out of the house bless.

♦ Who are you rooting for to win BBCAN5? If the answer isn't Kevin then you're wrong.

So I'm rooting for Kare - *tomato hits my face* n to win because I'm a fan of her confessionals and her one-sided Steve/Becky style animo - *tomato hits my freshly ironed shirt* sity towards That Kevin Robert Martin and how she thought he was a serial killer and how you can't trust anyone with three first names is *dodges tomato that whizzes by my ear* just downright hilarious and honestly I don't think she can win but that doesn't mean I ain't rooting the fuck outta her. My favourite archetype on reality TV is zany other women (ie. Debbie) and she is just GOLD.

♦ Do you honestly and completely believe that you deserve to be the first winner of SBBB and receive that sweet, sweet low-budget bakerswag2 trophy?

I really do. I have wanted to win since the moment I signed up for this game. I played hard. Maybe *too* hard. I lied and schemed and calculated and won shit and maybe outwardly it isn't that fancy, but I hope with my answers and through reflection I demonstrated I did some really awesome work. With it's similarities and what with working in tandem together, I know Tigress played a damn good game. She is, as you say, wicked at Big Brother. But if you compare our games side by side, I think you have to see I did more to get here, I won more, I avoided danger more more, I formed more connections, I had more drive considering she didn't even care to win when she joined; I was *more*. I **deserve** this title and trophy, and I will be disappointed if I don't get it after all the work I've done. Thanks for the questions Ally. See ya at the reunion.

TheTigress' response:

Oh yeah my tired ass forgot to specify - I was never on the block come time to vote when it wasn't one of my f2s voting. Sorrybowdah.

I will never discredit anything my allies did to help me, because there were absolutely times when I needed them to make moves and they did (ie. killic using PoV on me, Olive taking me to f3) but I believe I put myself in a good position socially and strategically early in the game and continued to do so throughout. I don't think there was really ever a time where I DEPENDED on any alliance to dig me out of a hole, and I would argue that any moves that were made to assist me somehow were done so because I had put myself in good standing with them. I came into this game with friends, sure, but we made up a very small part of the cast, and I had to form strong bonds with people I had never seen before. Like I said in my speech, I put myself in social situations to cover myself from every angle. Some of the people I ended up working the most closely with were people I didn't speak to much, or had never spoken with at all prior. I am the most thankful to have been part of the most dominant alliance, but I don't feel I was ever "carried".

If William had chosen to evict me, I would have voted for him to win. I mentioned in my speech that when I found out Olive had tried to not win comps on purpose, it completely changed my outlook. I know Floating is a completely valid strategy, it's just not the one I think should win a game of Big Brother. *points at Andy Herren aggressively* We all saw different peoples' games to a different extent, and I got to see both William's and Olive's pretty closely. Everyone will cast their votes for the winner based on different things, and mine would be cast based on overall game in my 3 fave areas that I KEEP MENTIONING AND I'M SORRY - Social, Strategy,

Competitive. In my eyes, I'd say William did a better job than Olive at more of if not all those areas. But again, that's just how I'd vote and what I'd vote based on.

If I had won final HoH, I would have taken William to f2 for basically the same reasons that I would choose to vote for him to win. I've seen TOO MANY Big Brother seasons where the f2 was disappointing. I fully understand bringing William to f2 would put my game in jeopardy, but honestly I'd be ok with that because I'd rather see someone who played the entire game to the best of their ability win it all. That's the emotional me talking. But when has there ever been another me, really?

I don't really see how I could have managed this jury and actually played a decent game. I could have not won any competitions and not made any big moves, but then what would I have to say? What would be the point of me winning? I honestly think the only reasons people have to dislike me are because I ruined their game somehow. Which is kind of the point of Big Brother. I didn't treat anyone unfairly, I didn't use anyone to my advantage in a disrespectful way, I was honest with people about how I felt and where my vote was going and why. Never did I cast a vote without meaning behind it, and never did I do so without owning up to it. With this jury in particular, the people who 'dislike' me don't have any real reason to aside from me nominating them, voting them out, or turning people against them to get them evicted. Basically, they don't like me because I played the game. From my perspective, the moves I made were actually lined up with moves other people made, but I'm the only one who got chewed up and spat out for them. There was a lot of talk about me pretty early on, be it because I knew another player in real life, was passing info around, whatever the reason was. I put information where I needed it to go in order to have an influence. I don't feel I wronged anybody unless they wronged me and botched our trust, or were putting my game in jeopardy. If playing Big Brother is going to cost me the win, so be it.

If being beside William hurts my chances, I am ok with it. The fan in me is absolutely overjoyed by the members of f5 all the way through to f2. I worked with William all throughout this game, I saw all the things he did to get here. I think this is a strong f2 and there's no bad option here.

Pretty dope, emotional wreck tho. Swallowed my pride. Worked my ass off. Risky business. #KevinRobertMartin. Sneaky while also being upfront. I got enemies, got a lot of enemies. Got a lot of people tryna drain me of my energy.

Tough choice, but I'd say my social game was strongest. For the most part, I was on good terms with people up until I told them I was evicting them/they were leaving. Some people I remained on good terms with even after flipping their game. I put my trust in the right people, people put their trust in me. I respected everyone and told

them how I was really feeling and what I thought was the best decision. I would spend a lot of time (hours) explaining why a vote should go a certain way, and my efforts would not go unnoticed. I would say the main reason why I'm even here in f2 is because socially, I put myself in a good spot so that even if I didn't win competitions, I had a hand in every vote, and I would likely still get here. Every eviction I was able to vote in, the person I campaigned against and ultimately voted for is the one that got evicted. All throughout the game I was able to help all of my alliances because I could get information from people who weren't in them. It kept me in the loop, which also sometimes helped me "manipulate" a vote by using information at the right time. My physical game was strong too, I won comps and made big moves which also tied into my strategy of keeping players I had a strong bond with and would potentially help me in the long run and removing players that wouldn't.

I would say one thing I did 'better' was making moves to benefit my game and owning up to them 100%. I think part of the reason why people "dislike" me is because I was vocal, I was open, and I tried to take control of almost everything. Even from the first week, members of my alliance wanted to vote the opposite way that I wanted to, so I grabbed that bull by the horns and went to work on why we should vote my way. This happened a few times, one time to the point that I was accused of being shady and working with someone outside our alliance!!! Gasp!!!!! I was not afraid to put up players who clearly had good grounding in the game, even if there was a chance it would come back to bite me. I wasn't afraid to take risks to better my game. I would actually wager that for each of my HoHs, while I of course asked for feedback, I ultimately put up who was best for me, and never once said "I'm doing this because my alliance wants it". At one point there was a push in Mishpocheh for an Ally/sammy nomination nonstop but ya girl wanted the Big Bad Dooze out, so up she went. I debated with people to get them to switch their vote. I straight up told people "I am voting x because reasons that would benefit my game". I made moves for myself, and I owned them.

My lowest point in the game was when I was having issues IRL and left house chat for a while, not to mention somewhat ghosted my alliances and didn't respond to people in a timely manner. I think some people may have seen it as throwing a fit or "playing the victim" and it absolutely may have affected my game and the way people thought/think of me. It may have made me look like a loose cannon, or like I wasn't dependable. Part of me wishes I had just turned off my computer and walked away for a bit and not let on that anything was happening. I overcame it by sucking it up, getting support from people in the game and moving forward. I also used whatever I was feeling in everyday life to fuel my fire in the game to push me further.

I don't really regret anything, no. There are things I wish had never happened for sure, and people I wish I would have trusted my gut about. But I think everything that happened in this game, while it may have hurt me initially, helped me in the long run. I believe the things I did and the choices I made play a huge factor in why I'm here, so there isn't really anything I wish I had done differently. Perhaps, like I said above, I would take back my anxiety attack(s) and not let them interfere with the game. I do worry about how that made me look and how it affected my game and others' feelings towards me.

My biggest and best move was hands down getting rockgirlnikki evicted. I learned about that f3 (Nikki/collokey/Olive) a few weeks prior but I kept quiet about it so that I could make the move when the time was right. Looking back at it, I actually think getting Nikki out was more beneficial than collokey leaving. I knew that eventually, Mishpocheh was going to come to a breaking point and I am pleased beyond compare that I was the one to make the first move, and was able to do so while still keeping trust with the other alliance members and people I was working with outside of Mishpocheh. Believe it or not, I really and honestly did have to fight to get enough votes to tie it up so I could be the one to drop the hammer. I truly believe that had Nikki not been evicted at that time, her f3 would definitely have taken over the game and this f2 would not be as it is. They were a force to be reckoned with for sure.

Not everyone will like my game, and not everyone understands me, and that's ok! I think it's all part of what makes the beautiful game of Big Brother everything that it is. Insanity.
