

COACHING AND OFFICIATING

Course Description:

During this course students will learn how to officiate a variety of sports. They will also learn the proper mechanics and enforcement of the rules according to the WIAA. Each student will be certified as a WIAA official in two different sports by the end of the class and have the basic knowledge to coach a youth sport. This class will introduce students to many aspects of coaching and officiating, including but not limited to the following topics: sport strategies, philosophy, conflict resolution, ethics, basic sports first aid and CPR, team management, motivation, out of season training, sports nutrition.
