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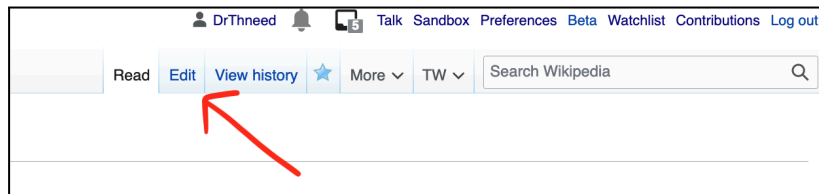

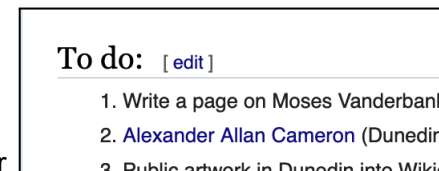

How to add a link to a Wikipedia page

1. Click 'edit' either in the section you are editing or at the tab at the top of the page



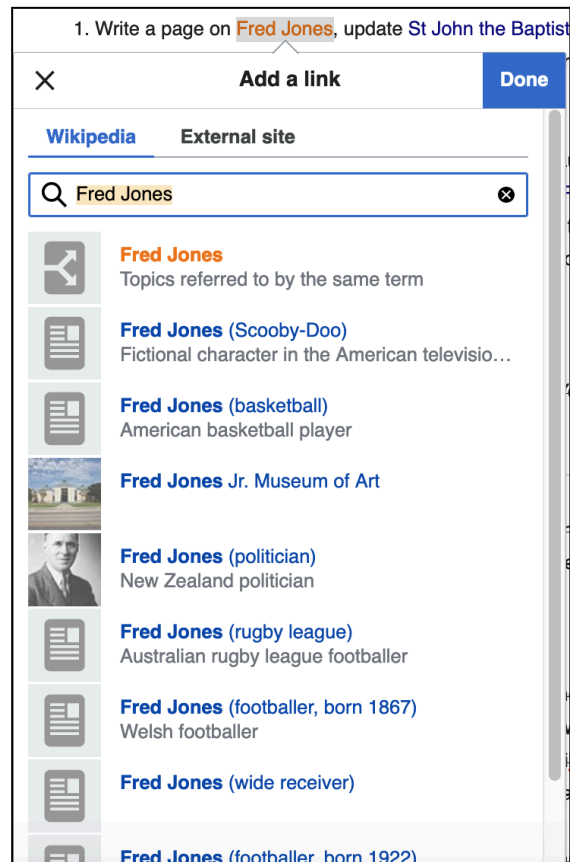

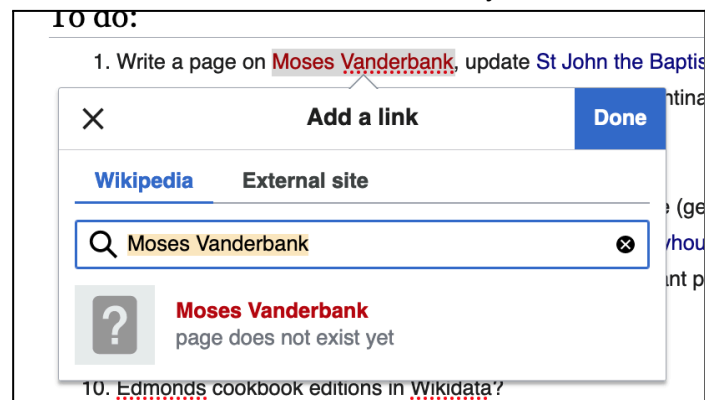
2. Find the words you want to link and select them (1), then click the "link" tool at the top (2) and then select the page in the pop-up (3).



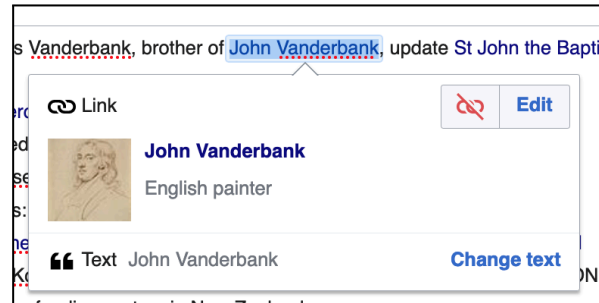
3. If the page you are looking for does not appear in the pop-up, it may not exist (check! Did you spell something wrong? Has the page been made with a different title, e.g. the name has a middle name or initial? If the page exists with a different title than the words you are linking from, just rewrite the words in the pop-up to match, the yellow highlighted words in the picture above). If it doesn't exist yet, leave the words unlinked for now.
4. Be careful not to link to disambiguation pages (like the first one in the list pictured below, the arrows where the picture would be tell you its job is to direct you elsewhere). A disambiguation page for Fred Jones is a page that lists all the Fred Jones pages on Wikipedia (so you would check that page to help you find the Fred Jones you want if he isn't obvious in the drop down list).



5. You can 'redlink' some words, which means linking to a page that doesn't yet exist. Only do this if the subject is absolutely definitely notable or you know the page is about to be created so the link will become 'blue' automatically once that page is published. You create a redlink by trying to link words for which there is no article yet.



6. If you pick the wrong link or change your mind about linking at all, you can remove or edit the link by clicking on it (while you still have the page open for editing) to get this pop-up and selecting either the edit button or the struck-through red chain symbol.

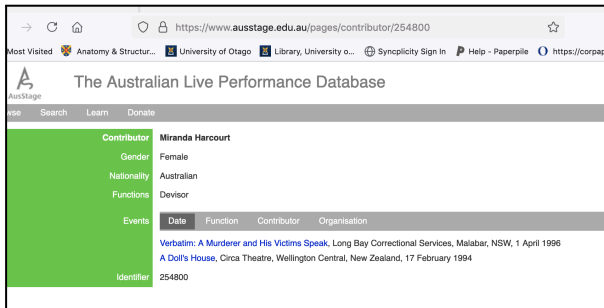


7. After you have selected your page, click the blue done button on your pop-up, then publish the page using the blue “Publish changes” button in the top right hand corner of the page. A pop-up will appear, write an edit summary in it so people can see what you did on the page history (e.g. “linking John Vanderbank”) and then hit the publish changes button on the popup. Done!

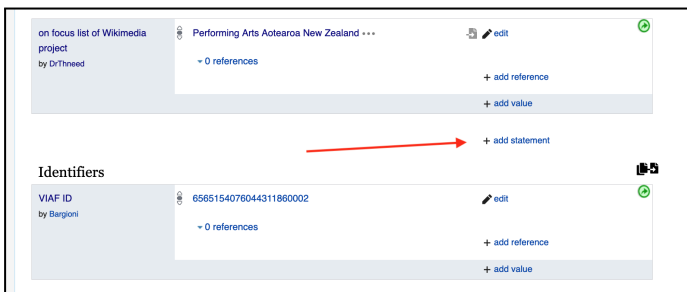

How to add an identifier to Wikidata

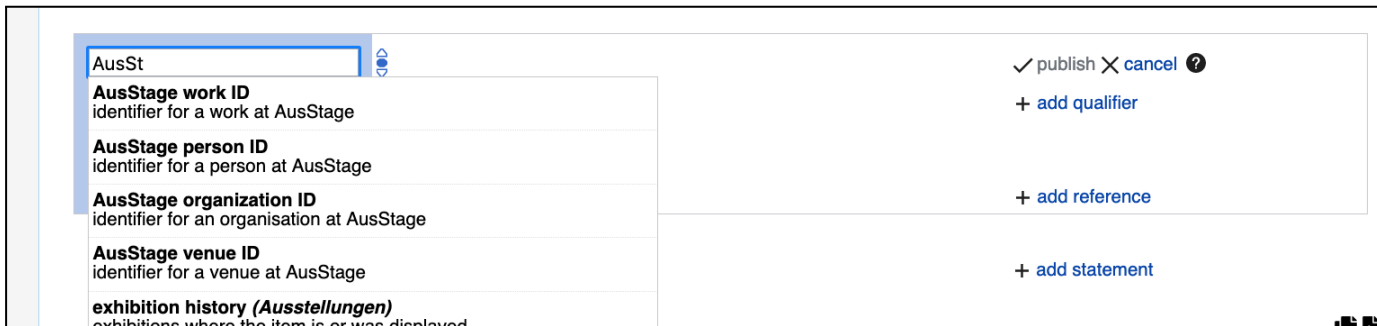
1. Find the person you are looking for in the target database (some links at the end of this 'how to'), this example uses AusStage <https://www.ausstage.edu.au/pages/browse/#> and have the Wikidata item open in another window or tab
2. I searched for Miranda Harcourt, her entry looks like this



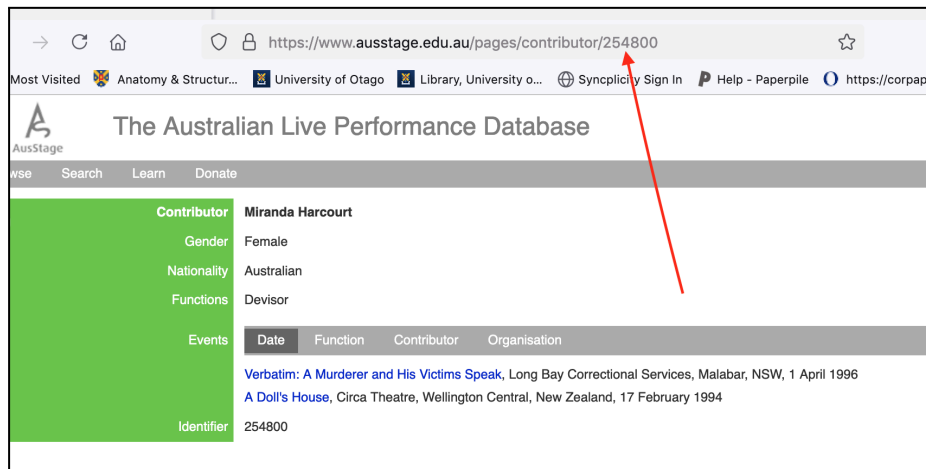
3. In Wikidata, check there is no entry for AusStage ID already (scroll down and look, or do a ctrl-F find on the page)
4. If the identifier has not already been added, let's add it! Click 'add statement' at the bottom of the page, or in between the main statements and identifiers.



5. In the left most box, start typing AusStage, and select AusStage person ID from the drop down list.



6. Now copy the numbers from the end of the URL on Miranda's AusStage page



7. Paste the numbers into the Wikidata statement, hit publish, you're done! If you click on the numbers just added, they will now take you to Miranda Harcourt's page on AusStage.

There is a template for a whole article at <https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/User:Stuartyeates/sandbox/academicbio> This is designed as a cut-and-paste then fill-in-the-blanks template for a biography.

Steps in publishing a new Wikipedia page

1. **Draft page** in sandbox or user space
2. **Move to mainspace**
3. Make sure the page has NZ English and dmy dates templates on, authority control, etc.
4. **Add categories** (look at a similar page for ideas, typically for biographies e.g. 1949 births, 1975 deaths, People from Dunedin, New Zealand scientists, University of Otago alumni, Living people) (either turn on the HotCat tool in Preferences, or add using [[Category:.....]] in source editing.
5. **Link Wikidata item to Wikipedia page** (from Wikidata, see <https://youtu.be/Qn4aNDwBea4> for 2 minute how-to)
6. **Create talk page** with appropriate WikiProject templates (see above)
7. **Look for pages elsewhere on Wikipedia you can link from** - e.g. the page about the place they were born or the school they went to may have a “notable people” section you can add them to, or look pages for significant production companies, award lists, or just do a text search to find if they are mentioned anywhere.
