

P1140 Public Participation in Meetings

At those meetings which are advertised and designated by law as public hearings, the public shall be entitled to be heard. The other meetings of the Board are conducted for the purpose of carrying on the business of the schools. They are not public hearings, but meetings held in public.

The Board welcomes comments from interested individuals and groups, and will provide time for that purpose during each regular meeting.

In any situation, the Board President or designee may limit the time of any presentation; and if there are numerous requests to address the Board on the same subject, the Board President or designee may select representatives to speak on each side of an issue. The Board President or designee may limit the time to be spent on comments from visitors and may impose such reasonable regulations as may be necessary to maintain orderly deliberations. The Board President or designee may also ask speakers to identify themselves and give their address for the record.

Persons who are seeking routine or specific information will be encouraged to submit their questions to the appropriate school employee.
