1. Apply the concepts of capital structure, sources of financial resources and dividend policy to long-term financial decisions.
2. Apply the concepts of working capital and managing current assets in making decisions related to short-term financing.
3. Examine the role of finance in the global economy
4. Integrate financial concepts into a performance analysis of a publicly traded company

I expect you to create the necessary formulas, format the spreadsheet so it is easy for me to find your answers, and include text answers if required. If you simply use the spreadsheet to enter values without formulas, you will lose points. All quizzes are open book, non-proctored. You can take each quiz as many times as you would like; the highest grade counts. Questions are all multiple choice formats. And, finally, even though quizzes occur each week, they never close.

Mid-term and Final Projects:

There will be two projects in this course: a Midterm project due at the end of the fifth week, and a Final project due end of tenth week.

- The Midterm project focuses on the debt and stock valuation of a company, i.e., the long-term financial aspects of a business.
 - The Final project is a comprehensive analysis of the financial situation of a business. .
- Both projects are graded on three elements:
- Presenting the required deliverables
 - Interpretation of the data
