

Dear Mt. Hebron Community:

The Mt. Hebron Intern/Mentor course is seeking volunteers to serve as mentors for the coming school year. Intern/Mentor GT is a course offered at Mt. Hebron where students spend class time engaged in an internship while also exploring a research topic through coursework with Dr. Kiehl.

Students have varied internship interests. There is no "ready-made" list of internships that we offer students. Every year, we start from scratch, researching local professionals who are willing to support a student intern.

There is no formal internship program requirement. The program is unpaid for students, as they earn GT course credit for participation. Most students are volunteers with one professional, rather than applying for a formal internship. Sometimes, students find their mentors through personal contacts and networking; sometimes, past mentors volunteer to work with a student again; and sometimes, we're starting with Google!

The goal is for the relationship to be mutually beneficial; students have a deep hands-on experience in a potential career field or college major while also participating in the work of their mentors. In some spaces, the experience is shadowing/observation. In others, students students play a role in the everyday work of the mentor - contributing to projects, completing research or professional tasks, etc.

As we prepare for the 2023-2024 school year, we are seeking professionals who would be willing to work with a student from roughly mid-September until the end of April. Students spend 4-5 hours each week working with the mentor (on-site, virtually, or doing independent work). The schedule is somewhat flexible. Student interests are varied, and include:

- ·Psychology (clinical, adolescent, forensic, research)
- Computer Science (cybersecurity, AI, programming/software development)
- ·Engineering (electrical, bioengineering, biotechnology, biomedical, aerospace)
- ·Law (any branch; politics)
- Business (accounting, human resources, finance, economics)
- ·Medicine (any field, hospital or office, physician, PA, NP, or nurse)
- Neuroscience
- ·Publishing/Literature

Rockburn Elementary School Scholarship

The Rockburn PTA is proud to offer a one-time \$500 scholarship to a former RES student who is pursuing a post high school education. To be considered for this scholarship, applicants must:

- 1. Be a senior attending a public high school in Howard County.
- 2. Have attended Rockburn Elementary School (RES) for at least 1 year in a grade between kindergarten and 5th.


