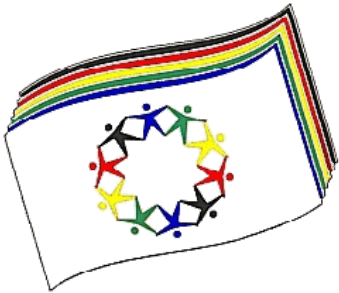
### Recently Held
