

## Locating Academic Quality Websites

1. Use a Search Engine ([Google](#), [Bing](#), [Yahoo](#)) or metasearch engine ([Dogpile](#), [Yippy](#), [Metacrawler](#)). Learn the pros and cons of both [here](#).

\*Search engines do not determine the quality of the websites they list within their search results, nor do they fact-check the information on websites, so you must do a full [website evaluation](#).

2. Do an [Advanced Google Search](#)

Type your search term, then NARROW YOUR RESULTS

Last Update: "within the past year"

Site or Domain: type ".gov" or ".edu" (to limit your results to governmental information or college/university sites)

3. Use an Academic Search Tool where there has been some human evaluation of the results
