

Britney is moving out – agenda for the council meeting

1. Someone from the tenant-council welcomes everyone to the meeting.
2. Someone from the tenant-council is chosen to be the secretary for the meeting, given the task to record the decisions of the meeting.
3. Start the meeting by giving Britney a chance to 1) state her intent to move away from the villa (most likely but maybe she has changed her mind...) 2) Explain why she has made this decision.
4. The economic agreement. During this part of the meeting you should agree upon all issues regarding money. Most important: Should Britney be forced to pay rent for the whole of the coming year as she has promised? And should Britney in some way be compensated for all the time and money she has put into the communal area: furniture, garden etc?
5. The freedom of movement. During this part of the meeting you should agree upon what access – if any – Britney should have to the communal areas in the villa and the garden. Should she be given the access freely, should she in some way be able to pay for the access or should she be denied access all together?
6. Irma the cat. During this part of the meeting you should agree upon how to make Irma the cat (and to be honest – all persons) happy. Can you find a way to let Irma the cat move between her owners even though they move on different sides of a wall – and can you do it in a way that doesn't let other animals and persons move the same way?
7. Open issue. During this part of the meeting Britney or any other member of the council can raise any other issue they need to discuss.
8. The future. During this part of the meeting you should agree upon the future relation between Britney and Villa Europa. The main goal of the discussion should be to see if everyone can continue to be good friends in the future.
