Instructional Materials	Students will read, periodically, from National Geographic's "American Stories: Beginnings to 1877. Students will engage in materials from History Alive curriculum.
Communication Protocols	Teachers use ParentSquare routinely, usually early in the week posting. Teachers also communicate through their school email accounts.
Grading Information	Summative Assessments=70% of grade Learning Activities=20% of grade Participation=10% of grade

Assignment List	There will be 2 Document Based Questions (DBQs) essays, several simulations, several group projects (podcasts, posters, etc.), and a research based presentation.
