

Interview Project: Part 1

This week you will begin your interview video project. In the interview project you will develop a set of interview questions to elicit ideas about a particular topic from your field of study or from the topic you are an LA for. You will then find someone to interview and either audio or video record the interview. The idea here is that you are developing a better understanding of student knowledge about a particular topic - this is not a teaching session - you are working on discovering what someone knows about a particular topic ... which could later turn into development of instructional materials.
