 - Maybe will see a BFRDP and 2501 in mid spring of 2026. NIFA administers both
 - NIFA may continue to do grant terminations

 - FY 25 did accept awards 2501 FOYA request NSAC

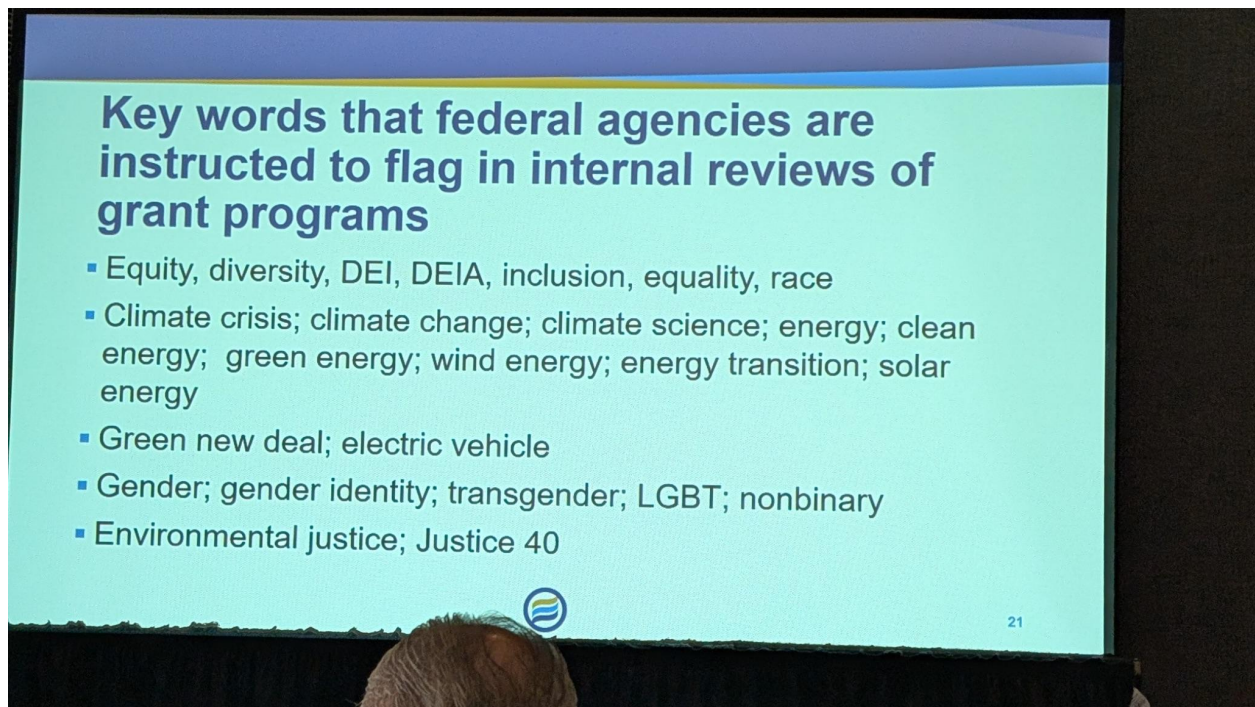

Risk Management for these issues

Orgs will be facing new risks and risk management and collective risk management will be an important thing to address/discuss

We, too, have experienced challenges with the USDA not only with changing guidance, but with staff turnover, and positions being vacant slowing down processes.

Other Grants:

- Breaking vegetable market boundaries. We are growing trials of these at NWREC. This project aims to create new market opportunities and improve environmental resilience. The team blends rigorous breeding with nutrition and flavor research, on-farm trials, and real-world tastings to bring more diversity and better flavor to meet the demands of today's consumers.
- Soil moisture sensor and automated irrigation scheduling. Developing soil moisture thresholds for crops in Oregon to help inform irrigation scheduling. We are hoping to receive additional funding to bring the trials on-farm in 2026.

 - OAT has heard that they were characterized as an IRA org so contracts have been paused
- Purge of Federal workforce - 30-40%
- Land trust alliance is talking about how to get stories to congressional delegation
- OAT is a part of two BFRDPs
 - TOF contractor and Building Ag Futures
 - Hoping RFP is coming out soon
- Building Ag Futures
 - Farmer training, registered apprenticeship, BOLI certification
 - A new org and volunteer leadership
 - Chemeketa and OAT are related training provider
 - Bringing in farm labor unions to be on advisory board
 - Training plan needs to be created and approved by Oregon State Apprenticeship and Training Council...
 - Connecting to workforce development boards
 - <https://www.bafpnw.org/>
- OSU BFRDP
 - Still in a holding partner meetings
 - Moving forward as planned, still unclear with where the funding is at now
 - Keep getting updates on federal funding impacts to the university
 - Wanting to be highly collaborative with the group to think about the next BFRDP
- Working Lands has Grazing Lands Cooperative Agreement
 - Agreement was last fall - so assuming its still going, doing billing with partners monthly
 - Diversifying funding with state and local grants
 - Had Q1 meeting with farmer advisory team
 - Wanting information up front as to where the funding is coming from - wanting an understanding of the risks
- Federal Readiness and Leverage Fund
- Interested in a call from Oregon Community Foundation
 - Call to action around folks Donor Advised Funds and what they can do to step up in this moment
- Zenger Farm
 - 3 grants - FMPP grant, specific language in it that allows - need to add the other two
 - FMPP grant agreement explicitly allows termination if USDA determines to no longer aligns with program goals/agency priorities
 - Shifts in USDA strategies - FMPP programs under review
 - Farm to School - grant agreement states that awards are subject to availability of federal funds and alignment with USDA priorities

- 2501 - grant cannot be terminated solely due to shifting priorities unless linked to noncompliance or “harm to federal interests”
 - Termination will require congressional action or funding rescission affecting 2501
 - Congress does only approve these grants through appropriation annually (next time would be in October 2025) - they could take action to stop funding at that point
- Zenger seeing a squeeze on foundation funding and business
 - 2501 feels more stable
- Sachin - copy-pasting email we got from Nonprofit Association of Oregon: *Thank you for joining us last Friday to discuss legal perspectives for nonprofits navigating the recent changes at the Federal level. We appreciate the questions we received during the webinar and continue to receive now. We know this is a developing situation and that this uncertainty is shared by so many in our nonprofit community. The full day workshops will be led entirely by Dick and include aspects of farm/ranch family business and estate planning.
 - Day 1 is intended for farmers and ranchers but service providers are certainly encouraged to attend as well. This all day workshop will help farm & ranch business owners work through solutions to common family business management and succession challenges. Workshop participants will gain insight on professionalizing business management or governance practices as well as preventing and reducing conflict in the family business. The cost to attend is \$100 with lunch provided.
 - Day 2 is a full day ag consultant training course for service providers. This workshop will help service providers implement consulting tools to better serve farm and ranch businesses as they work through the estate and succession planning process. RFBC October 2022 Update:

From Lauren Gwin, OSU Center for Small Farms & Community Food Systems

Hello F4tF,

Back in September, I sent a note to this list that OSU (our Center for Small Farms & CFS) was joining an 8-state regional food business center proposal to USDA, led by Colorado State University.

Here's an update on that, with some background on the RFBC concept/RFA.

[USDA Regional Food Business Centers](#) (RFBC) will support a more resilient, diverse, and competitive food system. These Regional Food Centers will support small- and mid-scale farm and food businesses, including supply chain partners (processing, aggregation, distribution, marketing), through training and technical assistance needed to be successful. This includes support accessing federal, state, and local grant/other funding programs. RFBCs will prioritize underserved audiences/communities – Black, Latinx, and POC, Indigenous and Tribal Nations, women, veterans, disabled, limited resource/beginning, and geographic regions with a high poverty index.

That's the background. I am now co-lead, with Colorado State the lead, for a proposed "NW/MTN" RFBC with 8 states that chose to come together: OR, WA, ID, WY, MT, AZ, NM, CO. State leads are mostly but not all reps of land grant universities and state departments of agriculture – but this leadership is about holding the administrative burden and moving a lot of decision making and most of the funding to partners and businesses on the ground.

The RFBC has four "theme teams": 3 focused on key areas of local & regional food sector development and a 4th focused on improving access to investment for local and regional food sector businesses and infrastructure, both public and private sources. (Navigating federal programs, guidance on state and private sources, support with connections/applications to improve success rates, etc.)

As we are structuring this RFBC, underserved & priority communities will be involved at all levels of the Center. Most of the \$10M per year of funding that flows through the Center will go to (1) training & technical assistance for individual farm and food businesses who are in/wanting to get into local and regional markets (2) capacity building grants to those businesses (which can include NGOs). And, crucially, to organizations led by all of the underserved/priority communities, who agree to serve as region, theme, or state advisors.

I am in conversations with the OCFSN Leadership Team about OCFSN housing the coordinator for the state level team for Oregon. That coordinator will be responsible for convening, communications, and facilitation. This doesn't at all limit participation in this RFBC to OCFSN members.

Why 8 states? USDA has made it clear they want multi-state regions. We had hoped to be part of a 3 or 4 state region, but USDA wants bigger. Within-state regions will be part of the Center through the state teams and theme teams.

This RFBC is not going to be a whole new apparatus that will suck funding away from what you are already doing in this arena. Think of this as adding more funding, connective tissue, and stronger goals/accountability on reaching/being led by underserved audiences to what already exists... and in Oregon, that is a LOT.

NEXT STEPS:

We will submit our NW/MTN RFBC proposal to USDA by Nov. 22. USDA does not want every detail now – they want a short proposal that describes our approach, especially related to underserved and priority audiences, the initial partners, and our proposed structure. Plus letters of commitment from each state and core partners at the state and regional level.

 - Jessica - is the project coordinator for a USDA beginning farmer Rancher Development Grant for Chemeketa Community College and OSU Small Farms in the mid Willamette Valley. They submitted a proposal last year to start an incubator farm in Salem to serve Marion, Polk and Yamhill counties and we were

hoping to start a training program and have an incubator farm on campus. The on campus site has since changed and so while we're still developing the training program, we're actually identifying partner farms now that would serve as incubator sites in all three counties. Applying for implementation funding for this project. Wanting to connect with the group to support farmers access to grants and support from federal funding.

- Shin - making OCFSN is an aggregate to help with not reinventing the wheel.
- Dee - Pathways focuses on beginning farmer training for BIPOC beginning farmers and has evolved to be very participant centered, rather than a one size fits all kind of moving people through track model. The land access piece is huge, OFB is offering land and water to participants. Often more community centered. Not graduating farmers from their program until they are ready. Focusing on just land access, leasing land and/or owning land. Talking about alternative models of land ownership cooperatives, collectives and benefits working in community. Dee and Jessica to connect.
- Alice - FoFF offers several different pots of TA. Hearing again and again from farmers that capital access is huge. FoFF submitted a LFPP planning grant (CALF project) to build a network of professional development to support farmer access to agencies and capital funding. Funding would support the creation of a If/Then decision tree website to aggregate information about funding sources - Future pending funding. New sustainable business programming through OPN this year.
 - Agency funding to be included in LFPP work - FSA, ODA specialty crop block grant, NRCS, SWCD (farm viability projects)
- Kathy - USDA BFR program offers quarterly sessions, and they may expand to service providers on supporting grant proposals. USDA staff is there to support service providers and support with different pots of funding. Upcoming urban ag and innovation grant.
 - Folks should connect with Kathy on USDA funding and she can support.
- Tanya - This sounds like it fits the SARE PDP grant (this is what funded the National Farm Viability Conference). Been doing some one on one technical assistance with farmers through Pathways and Headwaters projects. Been working with headwaters farmers for extended periods (more than one year). This model has a lot of potential. Really focused on the concepts for farm viability and helping farmers be successful. Has mostly been working with vegetable farmers and there is room to include livestock producers. Sales planning, yield records (these are essential), accounting systems. Know your cost to grow. Very important to have a connection to the service provider for continued support. Thanks for participating in the farm viability conference!

- Would like to connect with Alice and Jessica on their projects connecting it to Know Your Cost to Grow. Thinking 6 months ahead.
- Teagan - SARE PDP for share and cooperative models. Doing a focus group on cooperative models. Lots to learn from East Coast folks. Do a large farm tour series this summer and many of the farms to be visited will be veteran owned farms. Would like to connect with Jessica on this work and Teagan has an intern who is support the project.

- Heidi - Small Farm School is Sept. 12th. Folks are asking about barriers to farmers accessing grants for the program. Rich Swartz will be speaking from his experience working on the Value Added Producer Grant and others speaking on other grant applications. It would be great to have a video of farmers speaking on how they were able to acquire grants. Farmers learn best from other farmers. Are there folks who know farmers who would be good for this type of resource?
 - Is hearing from farmers that doing a listening session between farmers and legislators would be valuable.
- Matt - Rogue Farm Corps has included cooperative and collective models in their strategic planning as part of the Changing Hands and Farm Launch programming. Including this in current funding proposals (ARP USDA grant). Researching possibilities on registered apprenticeship programs. Need to develop an advisory team to guide this. Policy on farmer training funding on state level. Funding to go to host farms who are mentoring. Also looking into workforce development training funds. Moving to a waged employment model for training programs. Interested in exploring an online or hybrid "intro to organic crop production basics" short course potentially with partners. Also exploring partnerships in various locations in Oregon for entry-level part-time farmer training programs where RFC staff would be involved in day-to-day training (as opposed to having host farmers do all of the hands-on field training).
- Tanya - *from chat* I shared this with Andrew in the 1:1, and maybe obvious, but I think training on cooperative models really need to include/emphasize not just the legal structure but the organizational decision making/governance structure.
- Silvia - Navigate Program still has space, and is taking applications for BIPOC farmers. Second, the need and support for grant proposals. There is a lot of need and support in that area especially for spanish speaking farmers. Silvia worked with three farmers during the OCFSN disaster relief proposals. Doing farm tour with participants in the Farm Navigate program to connect with latino farmers

who are already working on this. If folks know others that would be good farm tours that would be great.

- Heidi- *from chat* Clackamas County has a goal by 2026 to increase food production by 10% and food production acres from agricultural land by 10% in the county. I was at the county commissioners budget meeting earlier this week and the commissioners were very interested in learning more about the existing farmer training programs that exist in Oregon.
