18 MOTION TO SET-OVER TRIAL DATE

19 Comes now Defendant, pro se, and moves this Court to set-over trial for one or several
20 months, giving these three reasons:

21 A later trial will allow the defense more time to seek a civil compromise with Portland State
22 University, which had not been recognized as a victim by the State until the 6th November
23 hearing on our motion requesting judicial notice of this fact. See pages 8 and 9 of that filing,
24 the section on “Hope for Civil Compromise with Victim”, for argument in favor. State has
already indicated an interest in an acceptance of such an outcome.

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2 Secondly, a set-over of trial dates will give the State more time to contemplate how they wish to
3 respond in the pre-trial omnibus hearing to our MOTION, recently filed by the defendant pro se,
4 [TO SUPPRESS EVIDENCE OBTAINED IN AN UNLAWFUL SEARCH AND SEIZURE.](#)
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6 Thirdly, trial date was set inappropriately, over the objection of the defense, prior to judicial
7 notice being taken, or the prosecution acknowledging crime victims in the case.
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9 This may have violated the rights of the alleged victim - Portland State University, under Article
10 1 Section 42 of the Oregon Constitution. Even if such a technical violation did not occur, the
11 court and the prosecution have shown disrespect and indifference for the alleged victim, a
12 disrespect such as is not shared by the defendant, who would like to appease and satisfy the
13 victim if possible, in order to achieve atonement and reconciliation. Also, the defendant is not
14 interested in wasting the time of 12 members of the public, or the time and resources of our
15 public servants on the Judiciary and in the Oregon Department of Justice, if that can be avoided,
16 and thinks that the taxpayers deserve that.
