

Mission Trip Student Leader Application

Student Leadership is not simply a title—it is a calling to influence others through character, commitment, and service. As a Student Leader, you are expected to model a growing relationship with Jesus, take responsibility for your actions and attitudes, and serve others with humility and consistency. This page outlines the responsibilities and expectations for those pursuing student leadership, helping ensure that every leader is prepared to represent Christ, the student ministry, and our church with integrity both on and off campus.

Expectations and requirements for potential Student Leaders:

1. Must be a strong Christian with a growing relationship with Jesus. Your choices and lifestyle should reflect Christ-like values and convictions, and you should have a good reputation among your peers in the student ministry.
2. Must be an active member of the Johnson Ferry Student Ministry.
3. Must be a Junior if you are attending the DR and a Senior if you are attending the UK to be a student leader.
4. Must be mature and responsible—able to be a leader among peers.
5. Must be willing to commit to an intensive discipling/planning process with additional weekly meetings until the mission trip. The meeting schedule will be determined once Student Leaders have been selected. Use this space to list your ongoing time commitments for these days:

6. Must have the approval of parents since this responsibility will require an extra time commitment during the week.
7. Must have a proper understanding of this position. Being a Student Leader is not a popularity contest—and no one has “earned” the right to be a Student Leader. This is a ministry role that gives you the chance to serve others and provide spiritual leadership during trainings and the trip by leading devotions, prayer, and by shaping the attitude of the trip.
8. Must have previously served with Johnson Ferry Students at events, trips, etc.
