At the end of the introduction, the purpose of the article review must be written. In the format of scientific articles, literature review is not permitted as in the research report, but is manifested in the form of a state-of-the-art study to show the scientific novelty of the article. **(12pt, Times New Roman)**

2. METHOD

This section describes the details of the method and how the analytical approach is used in conducting the research study. The description of the method is included in detail so that your research method can be understood and replicated well in other studies. **(12pt, Times New Roman)**

3. RESULT (this section may be combined with DISCUSSION)

Describe the results of the research / study equipped with relevant analysis. To clarify the discussion in this section, the article can be equipped with tables and pictures. **(12pt, Times New Roman)**. Add the implication and the contribution of your study.

4. CONCLUSION

Contains conclusions and suggestions. Conclusion describes the answer to the hypothesis and / or research objectives or findings obtained. Conclusion does not contain repetition of the results and discussion, but more to a summary of findings such as expected in the goal or hypothesis. Suggestions present things that will be done related to the next idea from the research.

Layout

1. The manuscript must be formatted for A4 paper size with the following margins: top 3 cm, bottom 3 cm, right 2.5 cm, and left 4 cm. (We recommend saving as from this template).
2. The article must be between 2500-7000 words long.
3. The letters used are Times new roman, size 12 point with single space paragraph

Tables and Figures




Figure 1. The comparison of results.

The table number and title are written on the top left side for a table (See Table 1). For image, the number and title are written on the left bottom side of the image as a source information by the title case (See Figure 1). It is suggested that the picture be inserted in the JPG format with good quality. For Tables, the title size is 12 and the content size is 10.
