AVID Elective 9 is an academic elective that supports AVID students during their first year of high school and prepares them for the rigor of high school. In this year-long course, students develop their growth mindsets, explore their personality types, learning styles, and college/career options, and engage in writing, inquiry, collaboration, organization, and reading (WICOR) activities. All AVID students collaborate for 90 minutes per week in tutorial groups with college and cross-age tutors to address points of confusion from their core classes. They also have opportunities to participate in motivational activities: college visits and guest speakers.

AVID Elective 10 is an academic elective that supports AVID students during their sophomore year of high school as they take rigorous courses to prepare for college. In this year-long course, students refine study strategies (e.g., focused note-taking and active reading), explore career options through project-based learning, and engage in writing, inquiry, collaboration, organization, and reading (WICOR) activities. All AVID students collaborate for 90 minutes per week in tutorial groups with college and cross-age tutors to address points of confusion from their core classes. They also have opportunities to participate in motivational activities, e.g., college visits and guest speakers.

AVID Elective 11 is a challenging academic elective that supports AVID students during their junior year of high school as they prepare to apply for college admission and scholarships. In this year-long course, students prepare for the ACT, explore college options, learn strategies for financing college, building their college writing skills, and engage in writing, inquiry, collaboration, organization, and reading (WICOR) activities. All AVID students collaborate for 90 minutes per week in tutorial groups with college and cross-age tutors to address points of confusion from their core classes. They also have opportunities to participate in motivational activities, e.g., college visits and guest speakers.

AVID Elective 12 is a challenging academic elective designed to support students in the college application/scholarship process while continuing the development of college-level skills. Rooted in WICOR (writing, inquiry, collaboration, organization, and reading) strategies and activities, students will compose college essays, think deeply about relevant issues, work collaboratively to solve problems, and perform research to prepare a college-level, multimedia presentation. All AVID students collaborate for 90 minutes per week in tutorial groups with college and cross-age tutors to address points of confusion from their core classes. Over the course of the year, AVID seniors will transition from tutorial groups to collaborative study groups to prepare for college life. They also have opportunities to participate in motivational activities, e.g., college visits and guest speakers.
