Introduction [Font 12, Bold]

The introduction should outline substantially the general purpose of your paper. As well as including the importance of research being carried out by providing analysis and generalization of relevant works that describe the essence of a problem and/or provide an understanding of efforts to solve the problem. Literature review should not be limited to works published in the country of residence and author's work (the issue must be reviewed globally). This is especially true for authors from non-English speaking countries (they are advised to thoroughly analyze works published in English). Explaining the research hypothesis which states the relationship between research variables in accordance with the research objectives. At the end of the introduction, the research must include the basis for the importance of the research being carried out. In-text citations must follow the reference style used by the American Psychological Association. You were referred to the Publications Manual of the American Psychological Association, Sixth (6) or Seventh (7) Edition, ISBN 978-1-4338-0561-5. Please make sure that any references cited in the text are also in the list of references (and vice versa). [Font 11]

Research Methods [Font 12, Bold]

The research methods section describes the main stages and procedures of the research to investigate a research problem and the rationale for the application of specific procedures or techniques used to identify, select, process, and analyze information applied to understand the main problem of the research. In detail, research methods must be explaining the methods used, the influences that determined your approach, and why you chose samples, etc. This section must focus to answers about collected or generated data, and the process to analyze data with the relevant analytical tools. [Font 11]

Results and Discussion [Font 12, Bold]

The **results and discussion** section is the main part of the author's contribution to research by providing a report in the form of an explanation of research findings based on the methodology you apply to collect information. The results section should state the research findings arranged in a logical order without bias or interpretation. A section describing the results is especially necessary if your paper includes data resulting from your own research. The research results section must include direct research data and their interpretations. [Font 11]

Tables and figures must be presented as follows: 1) Names of tables and figures must follow the Arabic numbering system. Table names and images are at the top and bottom of the table, respectively. 2) Tables and figures must include sources of information, if any, at the bottom of both; and 3) Each table may only contain titles and contents. The table contains only rows without column rows. Notes and sources should be included below the table if necessary. [Font 9 for Table]

All Tables and Figures (charts, diagrams and line drawings) must be included as part of the manuscript. Provide clear descriptions for all tables and figures. Tables and figures each should NOT be more than one page in the portrait (Avoid vertical rules). If the data is too large for a single table, please consider other ways of presenting your data. The font to be used in Tables/Images is 10pt Garamond. No bold and italic text is included in the table content.

The **discussion** aims to interpret and describe important research findings by considering what is already known about the research problem under study and explaining any new understandings or insights that arise as a result of the research process to answer these problems. The discussion will always relate to the introduction through the research questions or hypotheses you submit and the literature you review.

Conclusion [Font 12, Bold]

Conclusions should summarize part of the research results and consider next steps. The conclusions section also recommends new areas for future research and concrete implications of research with immediate impact. [Font 11]

Reference [Font 12, Bold]

Reference List: Authors are expected to follow APA (American Psychological Association) guidelines. Please make sure that any references cited in the text are also in the list of references (and vice versa). References must first be arranged alphabetically and then sorted chronologically if necessary and it is mandatory to use the Mendeley application or other reference applications. The references listed must be accompanied by a DOI. More than one reference from the same author in the same year must be identified by the letters 'a', 'b', 'c', etc., placed after the year of publication. [Font 10]

Web Reference: At a minimum, the full URL must be provided and the date the reference was last accessed. Further information, if known (DOI, author name, date, reference to publication source, etc.).
