

## KEY FINDINGS

A recent survey of 800 likely November 2026 in California demonstrates deep, widespread support for the California Voting Rights Act of 2026.

Voters believe that American democracy is under attack and there is strong support for taking steps to strengthen democracy and voting rights in California.

Key findings include:

- ✓ Only 11% say American democracy is not in danger. 68% of voters believe American democracy is under attack today, with another 18% saying American democracy is being tested but isn't under attack. 3% are unsure.
- ✓ 87% of voters support taking steps to strengthen democracy in California, with 75% saying they strongly support taking these steps. Support is consistent across race and ethnicity, with 88% support from white voters, 90% from Latino voters, 84% from AAPI voters, and 90% support from Black voters.
- ✓ Two-thirds of voters' support California expanding its own Voting Rights Act to guarantee that state voters are protected from discrimination and suppression. Only 23% oppose, with 10% unsure.
- ✓ 64% of voters agree – with nearly half saying they strongly agree – with the statement: “I want my state representative to prioritize passing The California Voting Rights Act of 2026 that will expand voting rights, protect democracy and increase voter participation.”

**Survey Methodology:** David Binder Research conducted a survey of 800 likely November 2026 voters in California. The survey was conducted between February 18<sup>th</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2026, in English and Spanish at the choice of the respondent. The margin of error is  $\pm 3.5\%$ . Voters were interviewed by phone and online (email and text to web) utilizing information from the voter file.
