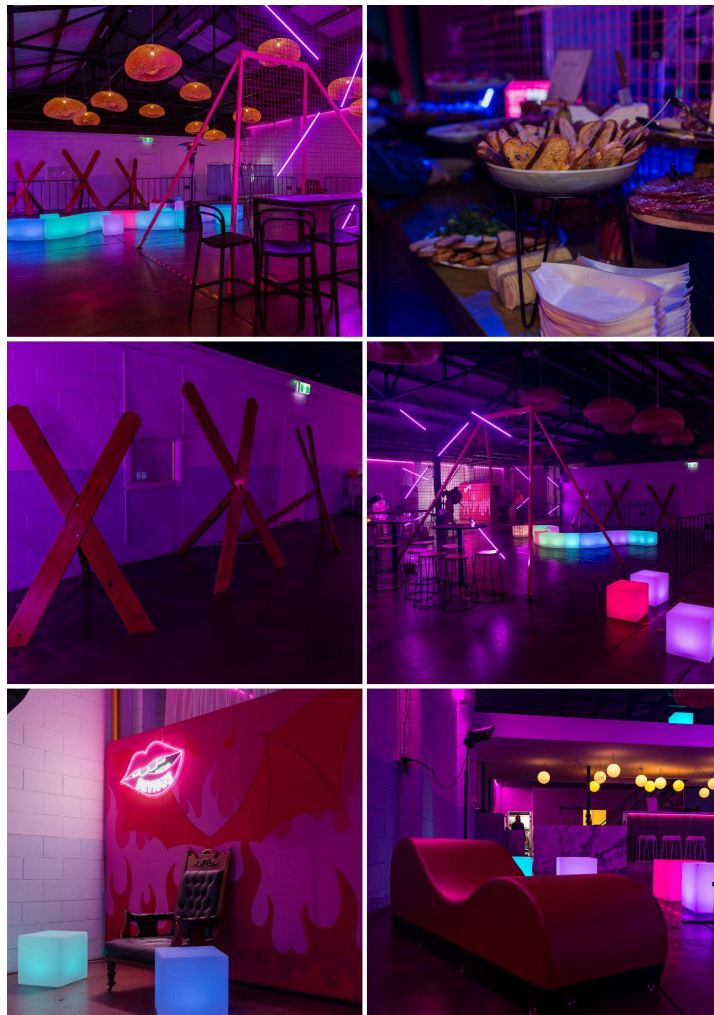

About Devious Adelaide

Our names are Nick (he/him) and Pixie (they/them). We own and run Devious Adelaide.

Devious Adelaide produces bold, inclusive adult events centred on consent, communication, and community care.

Our parties are social spaces where adults can connect, dance, observe, and express themselves in ways that feel right for them. There is no expectation to participate beyond what you choose.



What This Event Is

This is an adults only party and social event. It is loud, busy and colourful.

The night includes music and DJs, dancing, social spaces, themed activations and décor, and areas to watch, chat, or rest. There is security and staff working throughout the event.

You can expect socialising and BDSM activities such as spanking, flogging and bondage. People may wear collars and/or be led on leads. There may be littles, pups, kitties, doms/dommes, slaves, submissives and other kink identities present.

This is not a theatre performance. It is a party environment with multiple ways to engage.

It is not a swingers party. It is not a sex party. There is no sex on premises.

Drugs are not to be used within the event.

Age and Entry Information

This event is strictly 18+.

Photo identification may be required on entry. You will need to show your ticket and have the QR code scanned.

Entry is open until 10pm. After this time, entry may not be permitted.



Arrival and Check-In

On arrival you will show your ticket and ID and be directed to wristbands. You do not receive a stamp.

Event staff wear badges and are available to help orient you if needed.

There is an unattended, unstaffed, free coat check space. This space works on an honesty system.

Wristbands

Wristbands support consent and communication.

They indicate whether you are open to making new friends or prefer to observe, and whether you consent to photos.

Wristbands do not replace consent. You may change your wristband or your mind at any time.

New to Our Parties

If this is your first time attending, you will be offered a newbie handout.

The handout explains basic consent expectations and core party rules. You can read it at your own pace.

You are welcome to seek assistance at any time.

What to Wear

We recommend dressing up. That can mean formal or cocktail attire or fetish wear. Lingerie, leather, lace, latex, mesh, skimpy and slutty attire is all encouraged.

Please cover genitalia.

Nipples do not need to be covered. You can choose to wear pasties or not.

We prefer people not to come in jeans and a tshirt - what you wear helps create the fetish and kink environment for everyone attending.

Do not wear trackies or street wear.

Nick and Pixie like to wear bright colours, high heels, skimpy, slutty outfits and clothes that put a kinky spin on festival style outfits

Party Environment

The atmosphere is social, playful, and energetic.

Music will be loud and continuous. You may see people dancing, talking, flirting, or relaxing.

Everyone engages differently and all respectful participation levels are welcome.

You will see people using Saint Andrew's crosses, spanking benches/horses, bondage suspension frames and more. There are sounds of pain and implements hitting skin in these areas.

There is a medical area concealed behind a curtain where people do needles and other medicalised play.

Food is available on a grazing table. Drinks can be purchased at the bar in the centre of the party. Toilets are located at the back of the building.

Lighting

Lighting includes:

- Low lighting
- Coloured and moving lights
- Pulsing light effects

There are no strobe lights.

Consent Culture

Consent is central to all Devious Adelaide events.

Consent means asking before touching, listening to responses, respecting boundaries immediately, and accepting no without pressure.

Consent can be withdrawn at any time.

Consent can only be given freely when a person is of sound mind, free from the influence of drugs, not inhibited by alcohol (legal driving limit), has all the information and is not coerced.



Safety and Support

Event staff are present throughout the night and can assist if you feel uncomfortable, have questions, or need help. There is also security present who can assist.

Taking Breaks

If you feel overwhelmed you may step outside, sit down, move to a quieter area, or take time to breathe.

You can ask staff to take you to the breakout space, where sensory toys are available.

There is no expectation to stay for the entire event.

Venue Location and Access

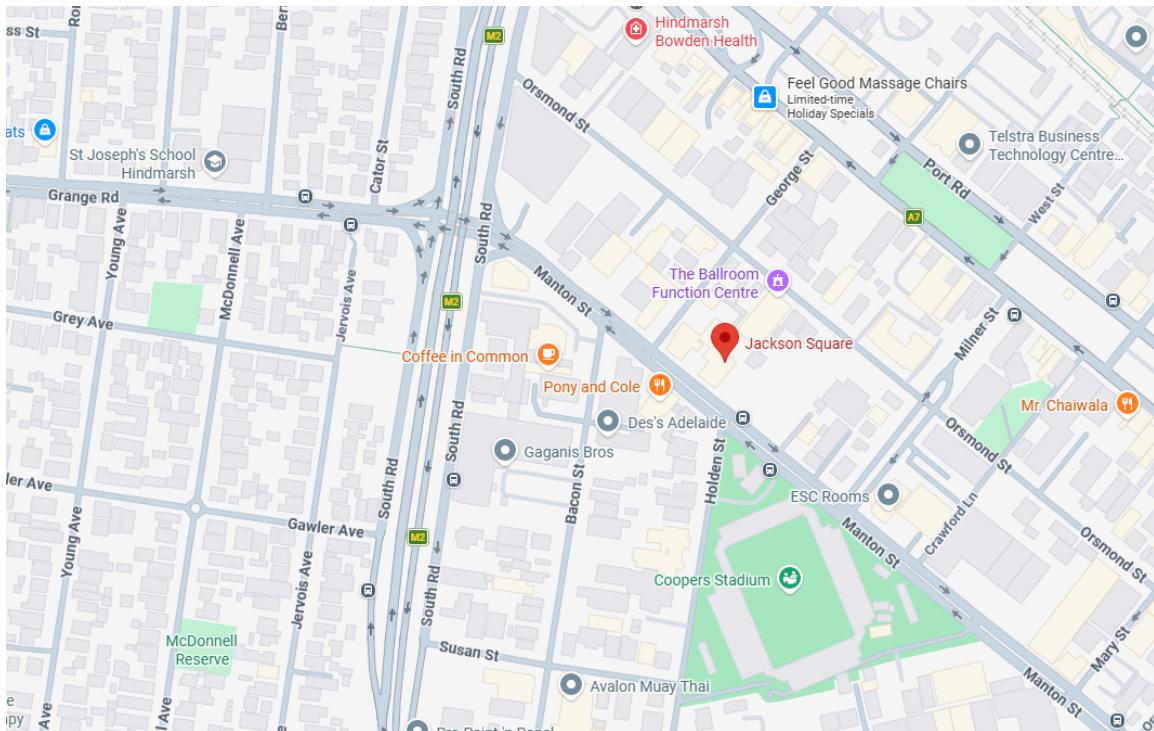
Devious Adelaide quarterly parties are held at:

Jackson Square

57 Manton Street, Hindmarsh SA 5007

Planning your journey in advance may help reduce stress on event nights.

The venue is step free and accessible for mobility aids, including the toilets. There is a section of the bar that is lowered.



Public Transport - Bus Suggestion

Take the 117 bus from the city.

Board at Stop T2, Grenfell Street, South side.

The 7.35pm service arrives at the venue in time for the party to begin.

Total travel time is approximately 18 minutes.

Get off at Stop 7, Manton Street, South side.

The walk from the bus stop to the venue takes approximately 1 minute.

Parking

There is no dedicated on site parking.

Street parking is available in nearby streets surrounding Manton Street, Hindmarsh. Please check signage and restrictions.

Photos

There is a photographer. You can consent to photos.

If you want your photo taken please head to the photo wall.

If you don't want to have your photo taken please ensure you are wearing a wristband and you will be blurred if you are in the background of any photos. We aim to ensure anything identifying is not recognisable, including tattoos. If we miss any elements in a photo you are welcome to let us know so we can remove it.

All ticket holders will be emailed a photo album link. Please do not share this with anyone who did not attend. The album is password protected.
