# Creating Colonies Using BookCreator

### Quick look:

Students will create a collaborative presentation using BookCreator in order to demonstrate their knowledge of Social Studies concepts.

## Scenario:

Fourth grade Social Studies students will use Book Creator to create a collaborative project that revolves around "Creating a Colony". This activity will follow the New Hampshire History Unit, where students will learn about European settlers, their relationship with the Abenaki Natives, and how they used natural resources to help them survive. Students will be asked to create and upload pictures of maps that locate their settlement, describe the resources they would need, the jobs they would have and link videos to demonstrate, as well describe how they would work with the Natives. This provides a great opportunity for students to collaborate and reflect on what they have learned throughout the unit. Technology tools that may be utilized are BookCreator, Youtube, Screenshotting technology, Google Images, Google Earth, and Google Docs.

### **SAMR Connection:**

My project connects to the Modification and Redefinition of a previous project of mine. Typically, I would have students work with paper. They would create a poster and collaborate through physical tools like markers, poster board, etc. By using this platform to create their colony, my students now have access to accurate images, the ability to provide new learning experiences through different media such as videos, and are able to collaborate with each other seamlessly through an online platform.

## Digital Citizenship Connection:

Students will be using a variety of Digital Citizenship competencies to complete this project. First, students will utilize skills related to *Relationships and Communication*. Through collaboration, students will be using the same template/tools at the same time. Students will need to understand how to use appropriate language, how to give each other feedback to edit their work, as well as collaborate to make decisions about the media they will add.

Students will also be utilizing the *News and Media Literacy* competency. Groups will be asked to integrate at least two different forms of media (images, videos, maps, etc.) Being able to locate and identify credible sources for this aspect of the project will be important. Students may also need to utilize a search engine in order to find additional information to support their project. They will need to be explicitly taught how to find a credible source.
