Title: Basic Conversational Chinese

Presenters: Snowy Zhang & Chris Mahoney

Description: This workshop is designed to introduce participants to fundamental Chinese phrases useful in everyday conversation. Whether you're a beginner looking to learn greetings or seeking to practice basic conversational skills, this session offers a supportive and engaging environment to start speaking Chinese.

Engagement Practice(s) Employed: Guided Skill Development

Guided Skill Development is ideal for language learning, as it combines direct instruction with hands-on practice. This method allows learners to observe correct pronunciation and usage, practice with guidance, and then apply what they've learned in real conversational contexts, ensuring a solid foundation in the basics of the language.

How the presenter used this practice:

- Structured Demonstrations: Snowy Zhang and Chris Mahoney will begin by demonstrating basic Chinese greetings and phrases, emphasizing proper pronunciation and context.
- Interactive Practice: Following each demonstration, participants will practice the phrases together with the presenters, allowing for immediate feedback and correction.
- Independent Practice: Participants will then practice the phrases in pairs or small groups, simulating real-life conversations to reinforce their learning.
- Consolidation of Skills: To conclude, participants will engage in structured conversational activities that require them to use all the phrases they've learned, enhancing fluency and confidence.

Adopting this practice in the classroom:

- Active Engagement: Encourage students to actively participate by repeating phrases and engaging in dialogues right from the start.
- Progressive Difficulty: Start with simple phrases and gradually introduce more complex sentences as students become more comfortable.
- Supportive Feedback: Provide constructive feedback in a supportive manner to help students improve without feeling discouraged.
- Peer Interaction: Foster an environment where students can practice with each other,
 enhancing their conversational skills through peer learning.

Assessment Strategies or Key Take-Aways:

- Formative Feedback: Continuously provide feedback during practice sessions, helping participants adjust their pronunciation and usage in real-time.
- In-Class Quizzes: Utilize mini quizzes to assess comprehension and retention of phrases and to reinforce learning through repetition.
- Practical Application: Assess students' ability to use the phrases in appropriate contexts, mimicking real-life interactions to gauge their practical language skills.
