CONTE NT	The study of the course "Economic Policy" is a general introduction to the knowledge and methods of elaborating the science of economic policy. Explaining the course "Economic Policy" helps students to better and more easily understand, explain and analyze issues related to economic categories and laws.
PURPO SE	Course objectives (module): The aim of the course is the development of academic skills as well as practical skills in order to examine the economic functions of the state and the system of state intervention in the economy in accordance with contemporary directions of economic policy development as a scientific discipline. The course of economic policy in terms of methodology and content aims to enable students of basic studies to get acquainted with the specific skills that are more than necessary for the development of their future career.

ACCESSIBILITY	The skills and abilities that students will acquire after the successful completion of this course are: • Understand and describe in different ways thinking about different economic phenomena (economic way of thinking); • Gain adequate knowledge of economic policy actions and its impact on economic, social and political issues of social life; • To know and understand the economic functions of the state, respectively its bodies; • Gain basic and sufficient knowledge of the interdependence and interconnection between economic policy and the legal system; • Understand and be able to operate with the primary terms of economic policy and various macroeconomic and social categories; • To know how the state directs the economic activities in order to maintain the stability of the market and the permanent and stable increase of the social welfare; • Understand that democracy cannot function and survive without the rule of law, just as a market economy cannot function and survive without state regulation. In this segment, the role of lawyers is indisputable as the instruments and measures of economic policy must be transformed into genuine legal norms; • Understand that as a necessary precondition for the successful functioning of economic policy, it is also related to many legal disciplines, such as: commercial law, law of obligations, administrative law, financial law, tax law, budget law, economic analysis of law, etc . ; • Understand that legal regulations through accompanying sanctions in the first place enable the stable functioning of the institutional environment, within which the economic policy environment continuously implements measures and goals which affect all activities, whether of production or consumption entities.
