Course Title: Ceramics 1

CTE Pathway: CTE credit is not yet available in Ceramics, but the process has begun to bring this option to MVHS.

School: MVHS

Textbook and/or other learning resources: All materials provided in class.

Course Description/Student Learning Outcomes:

Ceramics I is an introductory course. Students learn strategies to generate ideas, sketch, make, and share original art to explore 3D design principles as respectful members of a community ceramics studio. The course covers coil, slab, pinch, and wheel-throwing techniques using clay. Students speak and write to build vocabulary and critically analyze functional and decorative forms through aesthetic, functional, cultural, and historical lenses. Materials include clay, glazes, hand tools, and large studio equipment. Responsible and safe studio practices, independent and collaborative work, and oral, written, and digital presentation, reflections, and critiques are all part of student evaluation.

- 2. Achievement evidence collected within each grading category:

Rubrics are used to evaluate performance on all grading criteria when students submit their project packets online in Canvas. This includes evidence of meaningful class participation, timely completion of artworks, documentation of research and idea development process, studio habits, etc.

- 3. **Homework**/outside of class practices (<u>AR 6154</u>): Students are given adequate time to complete all work during class time. The only need for homework in this course is if the student was absent, off-task, or would like to complete a more advanced version of the assignment to meet their own creative goals.
- 4. **Academic integrity** violation practices (<u>LAHS Academic Integrity Policy</u>): All work should be meaningfully original, and substantially changed from reference materials to incorporate the students' unique vision and voice on their topic. If you have questions, please ask.
- 5. **Use of the MVHS Ceramics studio**: Ceramics materials and tools pose substantial health and safety risks ***if used improperly***. Students must adhere to all classroom conduct, safety, and cleaning protocols to earn their studio work habits grade, and to maintain a safe, calm, productive learning space for all students. Students who are unable to self-discipline in our ceramics studio will be referred to MVHS administration for disciplinary support and parents will be contacted.

- 6. Grading scales: Rubrics are shared with students and are used to determine assignment grades. A+ 98.00 to 100% A 93.00 to 97.99% A- 90.00 to 92.99% Demonstrated mastery with excellence. B+ 87.00 to 89.99% B 83.00 to 86.99% B- 80.00 to 82.99% Demonstrated mastery of grade-level standards. C+ 77.00 to 79.99% C 73.00 to 76.99% C- 70.00 to 72.99% Inconsistent demonstration of some key material. D+ 67.00 to 69.99% D 63.99 to 66.99% D- 60.00 to 62.99% Student is not yet performing at grade level. F 50 to 59.99% Insufficient participation or evidence of understanding course material to earn credit at this time.
- 7. **Excused absence make-up practices** (<u>Education Code 48205(b)</u>): Work is available in Canvas and students are expected to meet all online submission deadlines regardless of whether they are present for in-person classes. Avoid working up to the last minute to minimize stress and to submit work in advance of deadlines. Absent students should promptly review all materials available online and contact peers when circumstances are beyond their control and they must miss a class. In truly extenuating circumstances, contact teacher ASAP to arrange submission and grading of late work before the end of the grade window.
- 8. **Revision practices**: Revisions will be graded once, and can only be guaranteed if the student makes an appointment for an in-person re-grade during tutorial. Revised work will not be accepted for re-grading during the final week of any administrative grading period.
- 9. **LMS Info:** If you want to be sure all work has been submitted and graded, view Canvas. If you want to see information that colleges will see when transcripts are released, view Aeries. During the semester, Canvas is used to communicate up-to-the-moment grades. It is highly recommended that guardians view their student's Canvas profile as an Observer. This allows parents to see course information, view electronically time-stamped assignment submissions, and grades in real time, rather than discovering missing work once it's too late to submit. Zeroes in Canvas indicate missing assignments only.

In all grade reporting <u>for official school records</u>, the lowest possible assignment grade is 50% for a missing or unattempted assignment. Aeries is updated (at minimum) at established regular grade reporting intervals, per the MVLA official district calendar. Again: <u>Canvas is most reliable for real time updates.</u>
