

Tingkatkan Kejelasan Bicara Anda, Lupakan Aksen!

Panduan ini didesain untuk memperbaiki 7 kesalahan fatal non-aksen yang paling sering membuat komunikasi Bahasa Inggris Anda macet atau disalahpahami. Ikuti *template* ini selama 7 hari, dan rasakan perubahan signifikan pada kejelasan *speaking* Anda.

Cara Penggunaan Template

1. Baca: Pahami frasa yang Benar dan alasannya.
2. Ulangi: Ucapkan setiap frasa Benar sebanyak 10 kali dengan lantang dan percaya diri.
3. Rekam: Rekam diri Anda saat mengucapkan kalimat contoh untuk melatih memori otot mulut Anda.
4. Terapkan: Gunakan frasa Benar ini minimal 3 kali dalam percakapan atau tulisan harian Anda.



Template Latihan Harian 7 Hari Anti-Fatal Error

Hari ke-	Fokus Fatal Error	Frasa Salah yang Dihindari	Frasa BENAR yang Dilatih	Kalimat Contoh Harian
Hari 1	Error #1: Penggunaan -ing vs -ed	"I am boring."	I am bored. (Saya bosan) / The lecture is boring. (Kuliah ini membosankan)	<i>When I'm bored, I usually read my research proposal.</i>
Hari 2	Error #2: To Be vs Verb (Agree/Disagree)	"I am agree with you."	I agree with you. / I am confused. / I am disappointed.	<i>I disagree with the finding of this paper, but I am disappointed with the conclusion.</i>

Hari 3	Error #3: Verb + Preposition (Wait/Tell)	"I am waiting you." / "Please tell to me."	I am waiting for you. / Please tell me.	<i>Could you please tell me the answer? I've been waiting for it for an hour.</i>
Hari 4	Error #4: "Thanks Before"	"Thanks before for your help."	Thanks in advance. / Thank you so much.	<i>Thanks in advance for reviewing my abstract before the deadline.</i>
Hari 5	Error #5: Penggunaan Articles (A, An, The)	"I need idea for my thesis."	I need an idea for my thesis. / The idea is brilliant.	<i>A good student must submit the paper on time.</i>
Hari 6	Error #6: Uncountable Nouns (Jamak)	"I need some advices." / "I have many informations."	I need some advice. / I have a lot of information.	<i>The professor gave us valuable advice, and it helped us a lot.</i>
Hari 7	Error #7: Since vs For (Durasi)	"I have studied since 3 hours."	I have studied for 3 hours. / I have studied since 6 AM.	<i>I haven't seen that book for a month since the library closed.</i>
