- New studies
  - Lee: new R01 for an ADRD risk study with a large oversample of granular Asian and Latino population subgroups
  - Duke is an MPI of
    - Phase 2 AddHealth Parent study
      - Cognition measures among minoritized group
      - Recruitment video - English & Spanish
        - Work with studios; Several rounds of scripts
        - Feedback from community members
    - Study of Resilience; longitudinal; African Am 30-50 yrs in NC
  - Friedman: Puerto Rico PSID (in the plan for a data collection in 2025)
    - n=1500; in-person;
    - Similar content as PSID
  - Wang: Social connection → Health coordinated outcome in US (HRS) vs. China (CHRLS)
