Overarching questions: **What?**, **So What?**, and Now What?

Glossary

(W) What? Report the facts and events of an experience, objectively.

(S) So What? Analyze the experience.

(N) Now What? Consider the future impact of the experience on you and the community.

Student: You can answer these questions ANY WAY you want IF you can support your answer with evidence. Samples...video, letter to the editor, photographs, Prezis etc. It needs to support your answer.

Students may generate their own reflection question to answer (advisor needs to accept the question as valid for reflection)
