Customer Discovery

My target customer will be?

The customer has not pursued education in relationships in a formal setting (through workshops/courses) or informally (through books). The customer has not interacted with a counselor either.

Motivations:

- 1. A desire to get into a 'healthy' lasting marriage relationship
- 2. A fear that it might not work out (due to known unknowns or unknown unknowns)

Behavior:

The customer is demonstrating an intention to build a lasting marriage relationship by making time to interact with potential partner/s. If they have already found someone then they are spending time with them to deepen the relationship.

The customer is also feeling an increased sense of anxiety/pressure/responsibility when approaching the marital conversation. They are demonstrating this through conversations with friends/family members discussing various aspects about how to navigate the relationship.

My customer wants to have a mechanism to know if the person they are interacting with at that point in time is the right partner for them given the limited time and conversation opportunity available.

Research Methodology

User research will be conducted along the following techniques:

- 1. Walk a day in the customer's shoes Collect stories based on personal experiences of the team and that of close friends when pursuing dating/courtship.
- 2. Observe people having conversations during courtship Organize speed dating events or events where couples spend healthy time together to get to know each other
- 3. Stakeholder interviews
- 4. Playtesting using scenario cards in physical events
- 5. Playtesting using digital game in physical events
- 6. Social Media make a website and run ads to see the traction
- 7. Find similar courses/programs and interact with participants
