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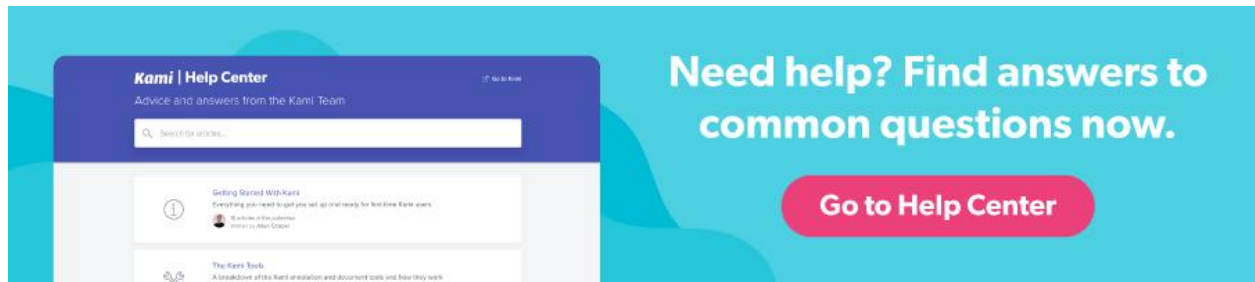

Workflow Explained

So, how is Kami different from simply sending paper worksheets? Here's a quick explanation of a Kami classroom workflow from a teacher's perspective:

Preparing your lessons

Rather than a static document, you can prepare a Kami assignment using the full array of tools available in Kami! Insert lesson snippets, feedback, prompting questions or out loud readings to help support students as they work through the document.

Allocating work and assignments to students

Send your prepared Kami assignments out to your students as a Schoology assignment. You can find the how-to in the [Kami with Schoology section](#) of this document.

Check students' progress in real-time

You can check-in on how your students are progressing with their work in real-time and even use the Kami tools to provide synchronous feedback, encouragement as they work. The ability to make real-time changes and additions promote a collaborative learning environment that you and your students can benefit from.

Easily turn in work with a built-in button

When they have finished their work, students will return the assignment (complete with all their annotations and edits) to you by clicking the built-in **Turn In** button in the Kami app. You can automatically see who has returned their work to you on your Schoology.

Grading with Kami

With Kami's seamless integration with Schoology, you can use Kami tools to grade work and provide feedback as you go! The assignment can then be returned to students, so they can see their grade and feedback—all within Kami.

Creating a Kami Assignment

- Go to **Schoology** and then navigate to the course you want. Click **Add Materials**, then **Add Assignment** from the drop-down menu.



- In the 'Create Assignment' view, click the **Kami** icon next to "Assign From App" to launch the file picker through Google Drive.



- Fill in the rest of your assignment details as you normally would, then click **Create** to finish.

Now, your students can go to Schoology and use Kami to complete the assignment!

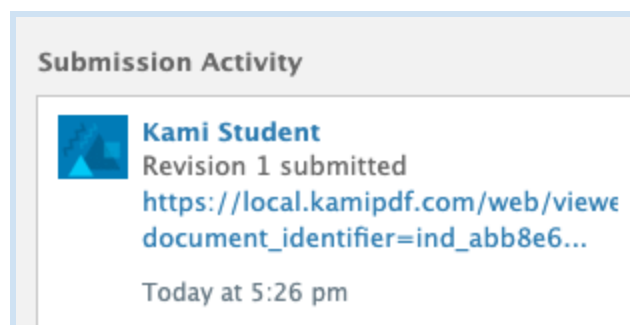
Grading with Kami

Students can send their work straight back to your Schoology account by clicking the **Turn In** button on their Kami assignment. From there, you can either grade their work as normal with Schoology's tools, or **with Kami**.

- In Schoology, go to **Submissions** where you will see all the work received from your students. Select the work you wish to grade.

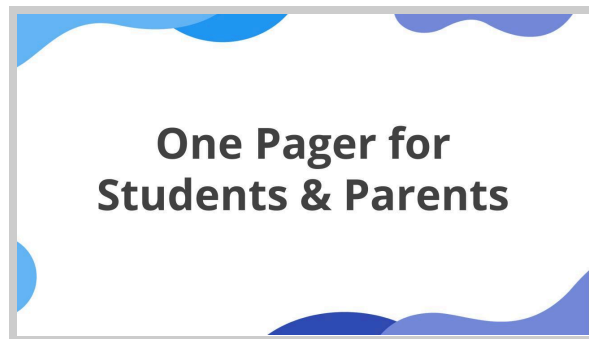
- On the right-hand panel, you will see **Submission Activity**. Click the link, as seen on the example below:

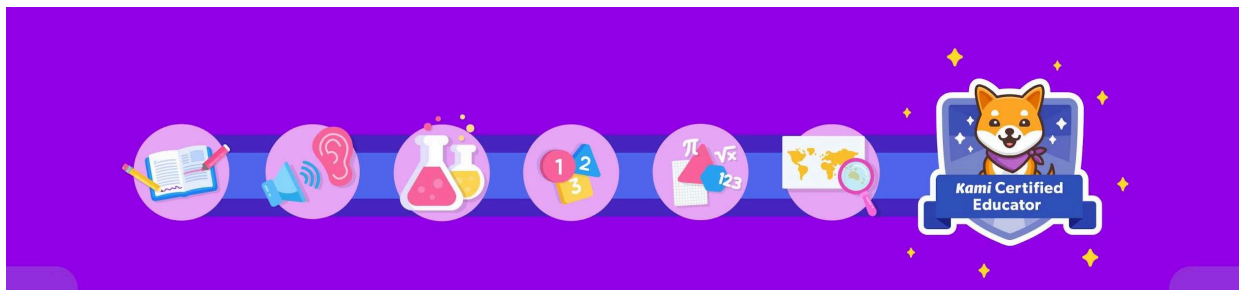
