## MATRIX LESSON FOR ALL SETTINGS

## **MATERIALS:**

- 1. Copy of the blank LIVE Matrix.
- 2. Copy of the LIVE Matrix (in students' agendas)
- 3. All Settings Quiz

## PRETEACHING:

- 1. Introduce the LIVE Matrix to students.
- 2. Ask students to define Leadership, Integrity, Value Safety, and Excellence in their own words or as a class.

## **TEACHING:**

- 1. Give out copies of blank LIVE Matrix.
- 2. Using an overhead, guide students through filling in the ALL SETTINGS column. Discuss the points as you go.

#### OR

2. Give students cut-out strips of phrases from ALL SETTINGS and ask them to arrange them into the right rows on the blank LIVE matrix. Discuss the points as you go.

## PRACTICE/FURTHER DISCUSSION:

Some options include...

1. Give the All Settings Quiz to check for understanding and further discussion.

2. Complete the *All Settings Brainstorming Activity* to discuss why we have a LIVE Matrix and school-wide expectations.
