The Department of Finance and Infrastructure is to oversee the complete removal of all Confederate flags, battle or otherwise, from Government buildings. Additionally, all symbols of the Confederacy and likewise monuments to it or its participants are to be removed from the property of the State of Dixie. These historical artifacts will be sent and offered to museums around the state. This is to be completed no later than January 1st, 2019. If no suitable home can be found, the artifacts will go to auction to private entities. The Department of Finance and Infrastructure is also tasked with renaming all public works bearing the names of Confederates or Slavery, Secession, or Segregation-sympathizers.

The Department of Labor, Education, Health, and Human Services will be tasked with renaming all government buildings named after Confederates. Likewise, all schools named after Confederates will be ordered to change their namesake to anything other than a person who was a traitor, an enemy of the nation, or an open advocate of policies like segregation, secession, and slavery. *Note: Schools named after Robert E. Lee may elect to not change their name, however, they will be encouraged to do so.* It can be changed to highlight a geographic feature, a town name, or any other patriotic figure in American and Dixiean history. The final discretion shall lie with local school boards. This is to be completed by the beginning of the 2019-2020 school year.
