


## **TURKEY**




As a stowaway in a boy's model airplane, Sammy joins the family's sightseeing trip in Israel and uses his five senses to experience the country.










Rhyming text depicts a family who visits Israel and experiences its sights, flavors, and landscape while learning the full meaning of the word "shalom."










SAUDI ARABIA



An Iraqi version of the Cinderella story in which a kind and beautiful girl who is mistreated by her stepmother and stepsister finds a husband with the help of a magic fish.












A Muslim father tells his daughter why she is special and why she should be proud and celebrate her heritage.


