
# South Bristol Rutherford Library celebrates Women's History Month with a free presentation by Maine author Anne B. Gass

Anne B. Gass developed her passion for women's rights history while writing a book about her amazing activist great-grandmother. The book, *Voting Down the Rose: Florence Brooks Whitehouse and Maine's Fight for Woman Suffrage* was published in 2014. In 2015 the research for her next book led Anne on a cross-country journey, retracing the route intrepid suffrage activists had taken a century before to demand voting rights for women from Congress and the President. The result was *We Demand: The Suffrage Road Trip*, a historical novel, published in 2021.

Anne draws strength from all the women who fought so long and hard for equality, and loves finding and telling the stories of courageous women forgotten by history. She speaks frequently on her research in hopes of inspiring others to continue efforts to win equality for women.

Join author and independent historian Anne B. Gass at the Rutherford Library as she shares remarks and historic slides about her historical novel We Demand: The Suffrage Road Trip, based on a true story. The story starts in 1915 when four women leave San Francisco for Washington DC on a desperate and dangerous mission to demand an amendment to the US Constitution enfranchising women. Their story unfolds through the eyes of unsung heroes Ingeborg Kindstedt and Maria Kindberg, middle-aged Swedish immigrants who own the car, do all the driving, and fix what goes wrong. They lose their way in a trackless Nevada desert and get stuck in the mud in Kansas, among many other adventures. Can they arrive in DC at the appointed day and time?

You can find out how they fared at Anne's presentation on Friday, March 24th at 2 pm at the Rutherford Library which is located at 2000 State Rte. 129, in South Bristol., Maine.
