Happy Thursday, Wonderful 5th Grade Parents!

Tomorrow is crazy hair/hat day!

In **ELA**, we are almost finished reading <u>Esperanza Rising</u>. We will finish our discussion on the plot elements in the novel, students will complete their digital Jamboards, we will dissect the various themes of the story, and students will take their comprehension test early next week. Students had wonderful things to say about this novel; some of them expressed that it's one of their favorite times of the day. We also read two short books; My Life as an Immigrant and The Junk Man's Daughter. In math, we continued working on unit 3. Students practiced both the box/area method of multiplying multi-digit whole numbers as well as the standard algorithm. Our 5th grade standard is being secure with the standard algorithm when multiplying a 3 x 2 digit whole number. Ask your kiddo how they feel they're doing with this or have them show you how they would solve a multi-digit multiplication problem. It has been fun to see all of their mathematical thinking and how they process and chunk numbers to solve multi-digit problems. The best part is seeing the light bulbs go off during the day and hearing their ahas! They have a great time practicing these skills on Blooket and Gimkit. During our Unit of Inquiry time, students explored different aspects of immigration through two different simulations. In Decisions, Decisions students played the role of the President of the United States facing an immigration dilemma. In the second simulation, students planned their escape route by making critical decisions based on real stories from Syrian refugees. They also continued working on their WeVideos and their digital portfolios.
