

What was communism?

Using evidence from Marx and Engels, Lenin, and Mao along with communist propaganda, define early communism (through 1920s).

- Materials:

- One or two sentence definition of communism or communist ideas is your thesis
- Use at least three of the sources to support your definition
 - refer specifically to the documents using authors' names or poster/postcard titles
 - quote, describe, and/or paraphrase
- Include historical context in sourcing analysis or interpretation
 - How might the events of the that the time a document was produced have affected that document?
 - Check the timeline on the last page
- Corroborate: explain how sources work together to support your definition
 - What areas of agreement exist between the sources?
 - What do the disagreements tell us about changes in historical context?
- Analyze sourcing: for each source you use, explain how author or document type affects the tone or content of the document

Key Dates:

1848: Publication of the Communist Manifesto

1914-1918: World War I

1917: Russian Revolutions

1921: Formation of the Chinese Communist Party

1922: Communists in Russia renamed the country the USSR, aka the Soviet Union

1924: Death of Lenin

1927: Beginning of Chinese Civil War between Communists and Nationalists

1928: Stalin fully in power in the USSR

1928-1940: Collectivization of Agriculture in the USSR (Ends the New Economic Policy)

1929: Beginning of the First Five Year Plan
