Research Team:

Capital Markets Equity Research Associate (5-6 Hours Per Week) (separate application)

- In this role, you will bridge the gap between traditional finance and the digital asset economy by conducting deep-dive financial analysis on 10 specific stocks with significant exposure to cryptocurrency.
- Your work will involve evaluating market correlations, analyzing corporate balance sheets, and identifying how blockchain integration influences stock performance and investor sentiment.
- You will be responsible for producing detailed reports that help our community understand the evolving relationship between equity markets and decentralized technologies.

Technical Research Associate (5-6 Hours Per Week)

- This position is designed for those with a strong foundation in computer science and/or data science who want to explore the underlying architecture of blockchain protocols.
- You will conduct rigorous technical research into topics such as smart contract security, consensus mechanisms, and the scalability of Layer 1 and Layer 2 solutions.
- By dissecting emerging development trends and protocol whitepapers, you will translate complex technical concepts into accessible, high-level insights for our readers.

Non-Technical Research Associate (5-6 Hours Per Week)

- You will examine the real-world utility of blockchain by analyzing global trends in cryptocurrency adoption and its practical integration into modern business operations.
- Your research will focus on the socioeconomic impact of Web3, exploring how decentralized systems are disrupting traditional industries like supply chain, healthcare, and governance.
- You will author articles that provide a bird's-eye view of the industry, helping the Northeastern student body understand how these technologies are being adopted on a global scale.

Technology Associate (3-4 Hours Per Week):

- You will be a key contributor to the club's digital presence by focusing on the continuous development and refinement of our official website.
