New Scholarships

1. Hagan Scholarship - All students who meet the criteria are eligible to apply for this scholarship. 600 scholarships can be awarded from the spring applications. To apply,

students must attend a high school in the US, must have achieved an unweighted 3.5 CGPA based on a 4.0 grading scale, must enroll in a four-year college or university, must work 240 hours from January 1, 2025 to September 1, 2025. Award recipients will receive \$2,000 to purchase essential items for college. Award recipients will be eligible to receive up to \$7,500 each semester. Go to www.hsfmo.org to apply. Scholarships will be awarded in April, 2025.

2025-2026 UNCF STEM Scholars Program - This program is an initiative designed to identify and provide scholarship and academic support for high school students who aspire to earn STEM degrees and to pursue careers in STEM fields. 100 scholarships will be awarded on an annual basis. The program enables highly capable young people to pursue undergraduate STEM majors and prepares them for successful careers in a variety of STEM professions. To be eligible, you must be a high school senior at the time of the application, be African American, Hispanic American, Asian Pacific Islander American, or American Indian/Alaskan Native, be a citizen, legal permanent resident, or national of the US, have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 on an unweighted 4.0 scale, pursued a rigorous course of study in high school math and science courses, including pre-calculus, have demonstrated financial and unmet need as measured by the student's college or university, show readiness for and commitment to pursue STEM majors, be enrolled for the first time at a US located, accredited college or university in the fall as a full-time, degree-seeking. first-year student. 3. Francis M. Barnes Memorial Scholarship Fund - The Francis M. Barnes Trust Scholarship aims to provide educational and/or career training opportunities to residents of Martin County, or others, through their influence, participation, involvement or leadership or residency, who are likely to raise the educational and overall level of

economic opportunity and prosperity of Martin County. Applicants must be of "good" character, must be a resident of Martin County and/or agree to return to Martin County upon completion of their sponsored education so that the county and residents can benefit from the educational experience made possible by th scholarship, have a willingness to work and study, but student does not have financial resources to support their own education, must be enrolled, or about to enroll, in an educational institution, such as four-year colleges, universities, community colleges, trade or business schools, and graduate, post-graduate or professional schools, must demonstrate sufficient academic ability to complete the student's required course of study, and must make reasonable progress toward the completion of a degree program as demonstrated through transcripts of the institution of Higher Education. Transcripts must be sent midyear and at the end of the year. This is required for the continued eligibility for the Barnes Scholarship.

Scholarship monies awarded by the Francis M. Barnes
Scholarship can be used to supplement other scholarship awards. The scholarship is renewable on an annual basis.
The recipient of this scholarship will be chosen by the Martin County Scholarship Committee. Applications are available in Guidance and must be submitted to Ms. Jayla Council by 3:00 PM on the deadline date.

The applicant must be a resident of NC for at least one year prior to submitting this application, be 17-22 years of age and either accepted or enrolled as a full-time student at a community college or 4-year college/university, submit a 250-500 word essay, have at least a 3.0 GPA, and complete the application.
