

- "She used to keep it on top of her refrigerator and "it never went stale"
- Homemade quesadilla with muenster cheese
- Talks about how his abuelita used to heat up the tortillas directly on the stove.
- He "fails" at this and uses a "comal" or iron skillet used for cooking tortillas
- "It's been really fun going down memory lane"

Conclusion:
