According to the State Health Department, no one (camper or adult) may be admitted to camp without one. This form must be filled out completely and signed.

PLEASE READ AND SIGN BELOW – PARENT/GUARDIAN & CAMPER SIGNATURES

Campers must be 9 years old by Sep 1, 2019 unless special request has been made and then approved by the staff administrator. We all want kamp to be a positive growing experience for each camper.

Rules for acceptance and participation are the same for everyone without regard to race, color, national origin, age, sex, or handicap. This is an equal opportunity program.

To maintain a wholesome Christian camp experience, it is essential that the following dress code be strictly adhered to throughout your stay at kamp—including the days you arrive and leave. Parents, please help us with this by making certain you and your children abide by the dress code.

We ask that all body piercings be kept to girls' ears only. No shorts, of any length, no halter-tops, tube tops, short shirts, sleeveless shirts, yoga pants, leggings, holes in jeans or any kind of immodest clothing will be allowed.

If you decide to dress-up (which is not necessary) for the banquet on Friday evening, dresses should reach the knee, not be low cut, and not sleeveless. If you have any doubts about the modesty of your dress, don't bring it. Campers will be asked to change if their clothes do not follow the dress code.

No smoking, drugs, alcohol, or bad language. Note: There will be no second chances—campers will be sent home. If illegal items are involved, the police will be called.

No pets, guns, knives, hatchets, or any type of weapon will be permitted and bullies will be sent home immediately.

Canteen is on our schedule three times each full day of kamp. Several options are available: pop, candy, healthy drinks (Vitamin Water, etc.), and even bottles of water. Fruit is available at each meal. We do encourage campers to either bring a bottle for water to refill or purchase one and re-use it. Each canteen time is limited to one candy and one drink. Water can always be purchased, but drinking water is available in the cafeteria throughout the day.

We ask that all money be handed in at registration. This money will be recorded as credit on the canteen card—whatever they have not spent will be given back at the end of the kamp week.

The directors reserve the right to send any person home for improper attitude or action or lack of cooperation, in which case, NO refund of money will be made.

All visitors must receive director approval before they will be allowed to stay overnight. All visitors will abide by all the rules. Visitors do not need to turn in money.

DIETARY NEEDS OR LIMITATIONS

It is our desire to provide whatever we are reasonably able to for a camper who has any dietary needs or limitations. We are open to providing a gluten-free diet based on two understandings. We are not responsible for a camper eating what is placed before them, or choosing to eat someone else's food if shared without our knowledge. Our staff will do everything possible to keep your child healthy with the understanding they must be old enough to take on this responsibility for themselves.

Secondly, if we have enough campers to add a full gluten-free menu for the week of kamp that your child is attending, we will communicate this to you. If not, then you will need to provide all the food necessary for your child. The cost of kamp will then be renegotiated if it is necessary to bring food from home.

Either way, we believe it is beneficial for our head cook to speak directly to you as the parent / guardian. This will help assure your child will receive the healthiest food for their week at kamp.

SUGGESTED ITEMS TO BRING

2 towels

flip flops or shower shoes

closed-toe shoes (hiking boots, tennis shoes, etc.)

shower items

some kind of bag to carry shower items

sleeping bag and / or twin sheets with a blanket

pillow

notebook with a pen or pencil

light jacket

sweatshirt

flashlight

bag for dirty clothes (plastic grocery bags work just fine for each day)

THINGS THAT WOULD HELP FOR YOU TO KNOW

You only need to **mail in your registration sheet** along with the **deposit and T-shirt money order**.

Bring the **medical health form** along with **camper / parent signatures sheet** and **final payment** for kamp with you.

Registration begins at 2:00 pm on each Sunday .

Kamp ends at 10:00 am Saturday. All campers / staff work together to clean up and pack up before anyone leaves. But **parents / guardians are required to arrive no later than 10:00 am.**

Mail for campers. Plan way ahead if you want them to receive mail while at kamp. Otherwise it arrives after they have left and unfortunately we cannot be responsible for this.

Cabin assignments will be made prior to the camper's arrival. Once all the campers have arrived, we will assure everyone has a bed and feels good about where they are. It has always been our policy to do whatever we can to help make each camper's week a fantastic one. We work with them to prevent possible homesickness to put them with a friend if age appropriate. These changes are not to be made by anyone but the appropriate staff member.

Lost and found items. Label, label, label everything. At the end of the week. items will be placed on the stage in the auditorium. The staff works very hard to help campers hold on to their items, but cannot be responsible for things they misplace. We encourage parents to look through these items even if their child feels they have packed all their stuff up.

Showers – Please help your children prepare for their kamp experience. Counselors do a great job giving hints and advice on how to gather and go to get cleaned up. However, it still comes down to the responsibility of your child to maintain their cleanliness.
