

Explainer Video - What is Figurative Language?

Last week, you explored the video creation tools in Adobe Express and saw the example video. “Personification”

Today your job is to select your topic AND create a title page in Adobe Express for your own Explainer Video..

STEP ONE - Skim and scan this very long document., [“What is Figurative Language”](#)
Do not read every word! Look through the document for something interesting that catches your attention.

STEP TWO - Select **TWO** figurative language examples for your possible video. (One of them will become your video, the other is a spare in case someone else already claimed it)

STEP THREE - Look at the papers hanging on the white board. Locate the section that contains the figurative language examples you have selected. Write your name beside the example you plan to use in your video to claim your topic. If someone else has already claimed it, use your spare topic instead.

Now that you’ve claimed your topic, it’s time to move on to Adobe Express to get a little design inspiration.

Locate Adobe Express from Class Link - yes, you may need to sign in....use your school credentials to sign in - do not create an account.

Begin a new video. If you are prompted, use the standard landscape format, then START FROM SCRATCH.

Think about the example you’ve chosen. What colors or backgrounds will complement the example and help display the figurative language in graphic form?

Use the SEARCH field to look for graphics that might work.

When I began working on my [Personification](#) video, I searched for “moonlit sky” and looked at the results. In a different search, I tried “stars.” I even looked for “dancers”
....

Add some of the graphics and backgrounds to a few pages in the new video. Remember, you are in the design phase. Keep adding pages, make changes, next week we will be more specific.
