1. Evidence	Information, facts, or details used to support a claim, argument, or belief. Use in a sentence:

3. Perspective	The way a person can view an event or object. Similar to a point of view. Use in a sentence:	
4. Primary Source	A first-hand account of an event or topic. Usually contains bias. Use in a sentence:	
5. Secondary Source	An account was created later by someone who did not experience the event. More of a summary of the event. Use in a sentence:	

6. Turning Point	<p>A specific event, decision, or moment in history that causes a major change in the direction of a society, country, or the world, often affecting politics, economy, or culture.</p> <p>Use in a sentence:</p>	
7. Fact	<p>A statement that can be proven true or false through evidence or reliable sources</p> <p>Use in a sentence:</p>	
8. Interpretation	<p>An explanation or understanding of historical events, evidence, or facts, showing what they mean or why they happened, which can vary depending on perspective.</p> <p>Use in a sentence:</p>	
9. Citation	<p>A reference that shows where information, evidence, or ideas came from, giving credit to the original source.</p> <p>Use in a sentence:</p>	
10. Propaganda	<p>Information, ideas, or messages that are spread to influence people's opinions, often by exaggerating, misleading, or promoting a specific point of view.</p> <p>Use in a sentence:</p>	
11. Bias	<p>Prejudice in favor of or against one thing, person, group, or idea compared with another. Usually people see bias as unfair.</p> <p>Use in a sentence:</p>	
12. Credibility	<p>The quality of being trustworthy or believable, often based on the accuracy, reliability, and expertise of a source or information.</p> <p>Use in a sentence:</p>	

13. Cause & Effect	The relationship between an event (the cause) and what happens as a result of it (the effect). Use in a sentence:	
14. Corroboration	Evidence from one source confirms or supports another source or idea. Use in a sentence:
