Modern Technology promises to keep us more connected but in surrounding ourselves with screens and devices. It feels as though we have lost something. Imagine if we could replace our screens with something that informs without distraction. Could we see differently, more clearly? Could it help us find that invisible edge when we need it most or allow us to connect in crucial moments providing vital information in an instant. Introducing mojo lens, the world's first augmented reality smart contact lens.

Put mojo lens in the morning and throughout your day. You will have access to timely information without losing focus on the world around you. Mojo lens is designed not to bombard you with data but to elevate your vision by providing the information you need exactly when it's needed all while letting you look like yourself. When it is not in use, the technology just fades away. We call this concept invisible computing. Mojo's invisible computing solution will be a platform that gives you everyday superpowers and an invisible edge throughout your day but before it does any of that. It first has to be a great contact lens that improves your natural vision even when it's off. Mojo lens built-in display will give you augmented reality wherever you look. It even works with your eyes closed putting you into an instant VR world. The applications are nearly limitless from being able to see in the dark or low light situations to augumenting your memory with instant information showing you real time translations or giving you a virtual teleprompter. One of our first medical applications is using AR overlays like edge detection and contrast enhancements to help people with vision impairments such as glaucoma and muscular degeneration. Building the world's first AR contact lens is a system's engineering problem and therefore we had to innovate in many different areas.

The mojo lens includes thin film bio-safe batteries to power the system as well as motion sensors to enable the world's most accurate eye tracking. We've also developed an extremely low power image that's used for computer vision and scene detection but at the heart of mojo lens is the world's smallest and densest dynamic display with this we can display crisp text, photos and video in a package that's less than half a millimeter in diameter. We are often asked -how do you control mojo lens? The answer is with your eyes. It turns out that your eye is an extremely accurate pointing device with our built-in eye tracking. In each lens, we believe, we've unlocked the ultimate hands-free user interface. I like to say, if it doesn't break the laws of physics, then it's possible and proving that something like mojo lens is possible. It motivates us each and every day to invent the future. Ultimately we believe that we can help people achieve their potential without sacrificing their humanity. That's the promise of invisible computing. Thank you very much for your time today. Eyes up.

We're the first to see behind the scenes at Amazon's launch facility.

Here's a parcel going out. It can't be bigger than a shoe box nor weigh more than 5. The Drone can reach customers upto 3 and ½ miles away. The rules are strict. Each flight is monitored and there's a human eye keeping tabs on it too. A flying robot that knows exactly where to go. How does it know, not to bump into anything so our sensitive way? Technology will observe a threat in the sky or on the ground. Make a course correction and safely find a path to deliver to customers. Drones are never going to replace Vans but this is a glimpse of the future online deliveries in just minutes and here at this Amazon site. In Seattle, a new drone is being unveiled. This is a drone coming to the UK. It's smaller. It's lighter. It travels further and it's most importantly at least 40 % quieter to our previous Drone. Is that safe? It's absolutely safe. It is hundreds of times safer than driving to the store. Just one location to begin with exactly how and where it can fly has still to be worked out. We'll scale slowly, we'll scale with communities and we'll scale

based on what our regulatory approvals are. Amazon believes, the demand is there. Here in America, though progress hasn't been quick but it's got big ambitions aiming for 500 million Global drone deliveries by the end of the decade.
